NARRATIVE OF INCIDENT (Chronological log, if applicable, to be attached)

On 4-29-2015 members of the Denver Police Department were assigned to the area of the Denver Detention Center to monitor possible protest activity. The Denver Community Defense Committee organized a demonstration to stand in solidarity with protestors in Baltimore and Ayotzinapa, Mexico. Occupy Denver members attended as well.

Available response personnel consisted primarily of District SCAT teams, District 6 DMU, Metro/Swat, Gang Bureau and Traffic officers. This complement was augmented by District 1, 3 and 5 Detail officers. The Command Post was maintained at DPD HQ in the Operations Support Division on the 4th floor.

The following message was posted on open source social media prior to the demonstration:

See you all in a couple hours. And please, if you are unable to respect a diversity of tactics, and understand that many will be there who have lost loved ones and are angry and tired of watching their youth killed by the police, then please sit this one out. We will not tolerate people trying to police other participants in the March. But if you can respect where people are coming from, understand that diverse reactions and opinions are necessary within social struggles, and that we are out there in solidarity with multiple uprisings against police terrorism, then we're honored to hit the streets with you in a short while.

By 1810 hours 25 demonstrators gathered in front of the DDC, just south of Colfax Avenue. The group grew to 60-70 by 1830 hours. At 1847 hours the group walked into the street to block eastbound Colfax traffic. Shortly thereafter they allowed one lane of traffic (north lane) to pass while blocking the two southern lanes. Members held up signs and banners in front of heavy on-coming traffic. Traffic officers blocked eastbound traffic for safety.

At 1854 hours, officers contacted the group and advised them to get out of the street. The group returned to the sidewalk and then began marching eastbound. Officers continued to marshal some of the members to keep them out of the street. The demonstrators continued to Colfax and Bannock where they entered Civic Center Park, then walked in the street southbound 1400 block of Broadway. Vehicular traffic north of Colfax Ave was stopped for safety.

At 1904 hours protestors attempted to knock Officer Monthathong off of his police motorcycle. During the arrest of that suspect, some members of the group attempted un-arrest tactics. Several arrests were subsequently made and OC was deployed. One ambulance was requested to address mace victims and another to dedicate to the remainder of the operation.

The suspect who pushed over Officer Monthathong was identified as a W M with a white shirt and blue horizontal stripes wearing a green cap. The same individual was arrested at 1918 hours on the west side of Broadway in Civic Center Park. He was checked by an ambulance for mace exposure. Two arrestees were transported to the hospital. There were two Use of Force incidents; 470, M3, and M7 deployed mace.

At 1930 hours the group began to move west into Civic Center Park. They marched north through the park across Colfax, left on 15th Street and then right on Cleveland in the street toward the 16th Street Mall. They turned left and walked in both lanes of the Mall. RTD was notified to halt the Shuttle Service.

At 1948 hours the group crossed Welton where some of the protestors intentionally stopped traffic flow. The group rallied between Welton and California for a short time. There appeared to be an altercation between the protestors and mall patrons. A victim subsequently complained of assault by a H M black shirt/coat tan scarf. The suspect apparently threw water in the direction of the complainant. No report was taken.

At 1955 hours the group continued marching north in both lanes of the 16th Street Mall. One protestor kicked and damaged a motorist's vehicle at Curtis St. The suspect was identified as W M or F black clothing tan camouflage backpack. The victim stated the car was scratched and refused a report.

Verbal orders were given at 2005 hours for the group to get out of the street at Curtis. The group appeared to comply. They walked south on Arapahoe to 14th, then left to Curtis, then left on Curtis back toward the Mall.

At approximately 2015 hours a member of the group apparently committed a robbery at 16th and Stout by stealing an individual's Iphone. Several protestors began running from the area and some of the group started marching back toward Broadway. The suspect was described as a H M NY Yankee Cap red shirt with white "VMMA" print (earlier wore a white collar shirt). This suspect was arrested at 16th and Court Place. Another individual was contacted and found to be C5.

At 2030 hours much of the group appeared to dissipate. CMD 6 Commander Lopez transferred field command to 600 Lieutenant Drajem and responded to the DDC for paperwork.

There were 11 arrests and 6 use of force/suspect claims of injury with two suspects transported to the hospital. Other than those completing paperwork, all resources were released and the Tac channel closed by 2100 hours.
