Trooper: BOWMAN Badge # 92

Narrative:

On November 16, 2015 at approximately 2130 hrs, I Trooper Bowman was on patrol in District 2500. It was lightly raining and the roads were wet.

I was dispatched by radio to several pedestrians assembled on the freeway in the area of northbound 94 and W Broadway Ave N. I was advised by radio to first meet at a staging area in the area of 94 and Dowling Ave N for a briefing. After the briefing I was directed to northbound 94 and W Broadway Ave N. I arrived to northbound 94 just south of the W Broadway Ave N overpass and observed multiple pedestrians assembled on the freeway preventing traffic from moving. I also observed several police squad cars from multiple agencies stopped with their emergency lights activated.

With my squad emergency lights activated I stopped my squad in the right lane facing southbound north of the pedestrians.

I exited my squad and approached several Troopers and other Police Officers standing north of the pedestrians. I was advised that four warnings were given to the pedestrians to leave the freeway right-of-way. Minnesota State Patrol Lieutenant Stricker SP2501 advised me to begin arresting the pedestrians still on the freeway after the fourth warning to disperse was given.

I was directed by Lt. Stricker to first arrest a male with a video camera on the freeway. Myself another Trooper and two Golden Valley Police Officers approached the male still on the freeway with the video camera. The Male was later identified as Based on Based on Being unlawfully assembled on the freeway after being directly ordered by peace officers to leave I placed under arrest for Unlawful Assembly. I placed in flexible hand cuffs and escorted him to a Metro Transit bus that was on the freeway. His picture was taken and name documented by Troopers stationed at the bus. was searched, placed on the bus and later transported to Hennepin County Jail.

was booked at Hennepin County Jail and released with a court date.

belongings were placed in a bag marked with his identification information on it and also transported to Hennepin County Jail.


Narrative:

On November 16, 2015 I, Lieutenant Jeff Schroepfer was off duty but the on call supervisor for the East Metro State Patrol District (D2400). At approximately 1854 hours I received a call from State Patrol Radio Communications advising me that demonstrators in Minneapolis were blocking entrance ramps to the freeway and starting to make their way down the ramps to get onto the freeway. At the time of the call, I was told that Lt. Steve Hanson was working in the West Metro State Patrol District (D2500) and was responding, but the Major wanted me to be notified as East Metro troopers would need to be utilized. I was told that radio communications would be on METAC4, and I advised that I would monitor.

A short time into monitoring, I heard that demonstrators were indeed making their way to the freeway. I then authorized D2400 troopers to be utilized and I would also respond. I also sent a mass email to text notification authorizing more Troopers to be called in to assist. While monitoring, I could hear that demonstrators had now taken over northbound ISTH 94 from the Lyndale Ave ramp. All northbound traffic was stopped and blocked by the demonstrators. Prior to my arrival, MN/DOT had arrived and was diverting traffic from northbound ISTH 94 to westbound ISTH 394 due to ISTH 94 being completely stopped by demonstrators.

I arrived on northbound ISTH 94 near the end of the ramp from Lyndale Ave., south of the exit ramp to Broadway, in the City of Minneapolis, Hennepin County. When I arrived, a small contingency of Troopers had a line of squad cars between the demonstrators and vehicle traffic. All lanes were blocked and Troopers were standing by their squads cars to protect both the demonstrators and motorists. There were approximately 200-300 demonstrators on the freeway and ramps.

When we were able to, traffic that had been stopped on northbound ISTH 94 was diverted down the right apex/ditch on the Lyndale Ave ramp to proceed the wrong way into Minneapolis to find other routes. When this began, that upset the demonstrators as they were no longer having the full effect of stopping traffic. At that point, demonstrators overtook the troopers, went past them and their squads and moved to block that grassy/dirt exit and not allow traffic to move again. With the number of Troopers on scene, we were not able to stop the large group without fear of being injured ourselves. A short time later, a driver in a dark SUV decided to try driving through the group of demonstrators to exit to the ramp. Fortunately no one was injured, but this further aggravated the group which led to much more yelling, chanting, and striking of the vehicle involved. Troopers did move in quickly to try and separate the group from the vehicle, and were quickly able to do so. In doing so, one of the demonstrators that Trooper Anthony Mains was dealing with, punched Trooper Mains, striking him in the side of his jaw. I did not witness it, but Trooper Mains pointed out the individual, who had now retreated back to the main group blocking on the freeway. I decided at that point that it was too dangerous to go into the group to arrest this individual. I feared that in doing so, it would've further aggravated the group. I feared that this would have even a further negative impact on the safety of the Troopers and feared being overrun and/or assaulted further by the group. The group was substantially larger than the number of Troopers on scene.



As Lt. Hanson worked to get more officers on scene, I coordinated other on scene duties such as building an even larger line of Troopers, Officer, and squad cars to further keep the demonstrators from the motoring public. I also dispersed flex cuffs to Troopers on the line as arrests appeared imminent. I also had contact with Major Frandrup and Colonel Langer who were further coordinating the MSP response. After speaking with Colonel Langer, it was decided that in attempt to clear the freeway and protect everyone involved, to give the dispersal notices. I gave these dispersal notices using the PA system in my assigned squad car. When giving the notices, I confirmed with Troopers on foot that they could clearly hear the dispersal order. I could also hear the notice coming across my PA system. The group also quieted when I started the dispersal order by saying "Attention, Attention". The first dispersal notice was given at 1959 hours. This dispersal was read off script and times were noted on it. See attached. The dispersal specifically cited MSS 609.705, Unlawful Assembly.

The second dispersal order was given at 2007 hours. The group again quieted and I again confirmed that I was clearly coming across my PA system, After finishing the second dispersal, the demonstrators then started chanting "Hell no, we won't go", leading me to believe that they clearly heard the dispersal order.

After giving this order, I asked Trooper Reed Bye to count the number of demonstrators who had now formed up in a single file line across all lanes of the freeway, inter-locking their arms. Trooper Bye advised that there were 61 demonstrators in this line. Which also told me that the group was obviously hearing my orders and some followed the orders and left the freeway as directed.

I also assigned multiple Troopers to retrieve their digital camera from their squad cars, turn them to video mode, and begin recording before and during the arrests.

The last dispersal order was set to be roughly 2 minutes after the second order, then arrests were imminent. However, other supervisors were still trying to coordinate arrest procedures and get the officers and resources on scene to make the arrests. When resources were moving into place, I gave a third dispersal order at 2042 hours. I again confirmed that it was coming across my squad PA system, and the group again quieted.

A short time later, I met with Major Huettl, who advised that arrest groups and resources were prepared and to give the final dispersal order and mass arrest warning. AT 2051 hours I read the final dispersal order. In doing so, I this time modified the order from saying "you may be arrested" to "you WILL be arrested". I again confirmed that the order could be clearly heard.

AT 2058 hours, the first arrest was made. The arrests were made starting at the center median wall and continuing across the freeway. All arrests that I witnessed appeared to be peaceful and cooperative. Arrested adults were placed into Metro Transit busses, juvenile arrests were initially placed into squad cars, separated from adults.

During and after arrests, I group was gathered on Washington Ave along/above the Lyndale Ave Ramp. Members of this group began throwing objects such as rocks, metal and other items at the State Patrol squad cars that were parked on the ramp below. I could hear squad cars being damaged from the objects being thrown at them. Do to this; we could not safely get Troopers to those squad cars to move them. Using other Officers/Troopers on Washington Ave., we had to disperse the group in order to safely get the Troopers to their squad cars. We also had to have Officers/Troopers remove the debris from the ramp and freeway before it could be opened.

At 2200 hours, the freeway was cleared and completely opened.

Narrative:

On 11/16/15 at 1900 hours, I was notified by MetroComm dispatch that protestors had entered the freeway on foot, at 94NB at Broadway, and were stopping all freeway traffic. MetroComm advised there were about 200 protestors in the group.

I immediately went to my residence, as I was off duty and not home at the time. I changed into my uniform and responded the incident command center. I arrived at MetroComm dispatch center at approximately 8:15 pm. I was able to monitor radio traffic and traffic management cameras.

I tweeted information as the Public Information Officer, regarding drivers to avoid the area of 94NB at Broadway, and also the detour routes so traffic could move through and avoid the area.

Troopers began making arrests of protestors who failed to heed the warnings to disperse or be arrested. The first arrested was at 2058.

As arrests were occurring, I was getting media inquires. I set a media briefing location to be at 2145 at the Old Colony gas station. I set the briefing time/location via Twitter. I then heard MSP supervisors request assistance from Minneapolis PD, as protestors were throwing bottles and rocks at squads parked off the freeway, immediately in the vicinity of the Old Colony Gas station.

Due to the risk of the media being hurt or injured, or inciting violence in the crowd due to a media event in the heat of the incident, I then relocated the media availability to the old MnDOT shop parking lot, off Dowling Ave/N.

Washington Ave. Upon the location change, I had one news outlet tell me thank you for moving the location.

I briefed the media at 2145, as to the number of arrests, and the safety concerns that were present with this group marching onto a freeway at night, in the rain, in an area where there is a blind curve to approaching traffic.

During the media briefing, I was asked if Jack Highberger was arrested. I was familiar with Jack Highberger's name, as a Fox 9 news reporter. At that time, I had no information on the names of the arrested persons. I had been informed by MSP supervisors that the persons arrested were those that fail to respond to four dispersal commands to leave the area.

I completed the media availability at approximately 2200 hours.

I received an email inquiry from Fox 9 news desk, asking if Jack Highberger had been arrested. I checked with Captain Eric Roeske, who was the supervisor at the Hennepin County Jail assisting with the arriving protestors. He informed me that Jack Highberger was arrested and was at the jail.

I then notified Fox 9 news, the public data that Jack Highberger was arrested and booked at Hennepin County Jail.

Of note, in the coverage I later watched of the protest on the freeway, many reporters filmed from the freeway frontage road of Broadway or Washington Ave. The only reporter and news outlet that had coverage from on the actual freeway was Jack Highberger and Fox 9 news.





STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

That on November 16, 2015, at approximately 6:54 P.M. Minnesota State Patrol Lieutenant Schroepfer received information that a group of demonstrators had blocked Broadway entrance ramps to Westbound Interstate 94 in the City of Minneapolis, Hennepin County, State of Minnesota, and were making their way onto the freeway. Trooper Schroepfer arrived on scene and observed approximately 200 to 300 demonstrators on the freeway and ramps. All northbound traffic was at a complete stop because of the demonstrators. At 7:59 P.M. a dispersal notice was given over a public announcement system specifically telling all demonstrators to leave the freeway. A second dispersal order was given at 8:07 P.M. Trooper Schroepfer observed a group of about 61 demonstrators had formed a single file line across all lanes of the freeway interlocking their arms at this point. A third dispersal order was given at 8:42 P.M. The final dispersal order was given at 8:51 P.M. indicating that demonstrators would be arrested. At that time the Minnesota State Patrol began arresting demonstrators still blocking the freeway. At approximately 9:30 P.M. Trooper Bowman responded to scene to assist with making arrests. Trooper Bowman observed a male, later identified as defendant herein, with a video camera on the freeway. The Defendant was interfering with vehicular traffic on the freeway. Trooper Bowman approached Defendant and placed him under arrest.
