Beginning at 0600 hours on 1-20-17 members of the Denver Police Department were assigned to the area of downtown and Civic Center Park in response to anticipated protests related to the Presidential Inauguration. [REDACTED] Representatives were present from [REDACTED] event was logged under CAD#17-42766.

### Morning Activity

0748 hours Individuals were observed handing out flyers on the 15<sup>th</sup> Street Pedestrian Bridge (16<sup>th</sup> and Central).

0810 hours

[REDACTED] removed a sign from the 15<sup>th</sup> Street pedestrian bridge that said "F\*\*\* Trump". The sign was facing northbound traffic and appeared to be permanently affixed with padlocks. [REDACTED] The sign was placed into Property.

0810 hours

Apparent **Anti-Trump** demonstrators began to gather on the west side of the **State Capitol**.

0830 hours

100-125 students left **East High School** westbound and toward E. 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue. DPS Security units helped manage the walkout. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]. The group stayed on the sidewalk and walked toward the Capitol via E. 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

0835 hours

A group of protestors was observed in Civic Center Park.

0855 hours

0856 hours

The State Capitol group grew to 75 – 100 people.

0857 hours

A group of possible demonstrators wearing black and with faces covered was observed at 17<sup>th</sup> and Wazee.

0900 hours

The East High School students arrived at the State Capitol (Route: 16<sup>th</sup> to Franklin to Colfax to the Capitol).

0904 hours

0925 hours

The group at the Capitol grew to around 500 hundred people and began amplified speeches.

0930 hours

0940 hours

[REDACTED]

Approximately 12 students at **DSA School** (7111 Montview Blvd) demonstrated on the campus (no march).

0945 hours [REDACTED]

0946 hours The **Anti-Trump** protest group at the Capitol staged near the east side of Lincoln Street. They walked westbound across Lincoln in front of traffic and continued across Broadway into Civic Center Park. The group grew to around 1000 by this time.

0950 hours [REDACTED]

0958 hours The large protest group marched north through Civic Center Park and walked unpermitted in the street on 15<sup>th</sup> Street into downtown. [REDACTED]

10005 hours A group of about 20 **Trump Supporters** left Colfax and Bannock and walked into downtown via 15<sup>th</sup> and Cleveland. They joined the anti-trump march.

1000 hours [REDACTED]

1015 hours The march stopped at 15<sup>th</sup> and Champa to rally. At this time the **Trump Supporters** confronted the Anti-Trump group by yelling and arguing. The **Anti-Trump** group turned right on Arapahoe toward 17<sup>th</sup>, continuing to march unpermitted in the streets. The **Pro-Trump** group walked in an opposite direction.

1020 hours According to DPS, approximately 38 students walked out of **CLA School** (200 E. 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue) in an unknown direction.

1028 hours The **Anti-Trump** group turned right on 17<sup>th</sup> Street and marched in the street toward Broadway.

1030 hours A white van was observed following the group with two occupants that were masked. The van pulled into the 1400 Lawrence/Larimer alley and the two occupants left the vehicle. [REDACTED]. The parties were found to be Code 4.

1055 hours The **Anti-Trump** marchers turned south on Broadway and continued to march unpermitted in the street. Members of the group began chanting "Take the Highway".

1100 hours The small group of **Trump Supporters** were observed at Colfax and Broadway.

1107 hours The **Anti-Trump** group marched toward Civic Center Park and then back to the State Capitol. [REDACTED]

1108 hours DHMC responded to an East HS participant ([REDACTED]) who passed out at 17<sup>th</sup> and Broadway. Party transported to PSL. At 1115 hours a second student ([REDACTED]) was transported from 16<sup>th</sup> and Broadway to PSL for asthma-related difficulties.

1117 hours An individual ([REDACTED]) was observed burning a small flag on the SE corner of Colfax and Broadway in an apparent attempt to antagonize the Trump Supporters.

1132 hours Around 100 **Anti-Trump** demonstrators remained at the State Capitol but ultimately dissipated. Around 30-40 **East HS** students were observed walking back to the school (on the sidewalks). [REDACTED]

**Afternoon Activity**

- 1205 hours Around 100 students walked out of **DCIS Montbello** (5000 Crown Blvd) with a planned route to the McGlone YMCA. Fox 31 News requested to stage on the property but was denied by DPS. The students returned to the school by 1237 hours without incident.
- 1208 hours A small group of protestors began to gather for a permitted demonstration at the **State Capitol**.
- 1210 hours 20-30 demonstrators were observed gathering at 17<sup>th</sup> and Arapahoe for a **Permitted March**. Some group members entered the Chase Bank building (1125 17<sup>th</sup> Street) to present a "List of Demands" to Senator Gardner. The protestors were stopped in the lobby where they rallied for a short time and then left.
- 1235 hours About 30 marchers stepped off from 1125 17<sup>th</sup> Street for the **Permitted March**. The route traveled 17<sup>th</sup> Street to Broadway, south to 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue, east to Sherman and then south to Senator Bennett's office at 1127 Sherman.
- 1315 hours **Permitted March** arrives at Senator Bennet's office. Some demonstrators rallied inside the building.
- 1326 hours Protestors hung banners (anti-pipeline theme) on the 16<sup>th</sup> Street bridge over I-25. The banners were removed and taken to Property [REDACTED].
- 1450 hours [REDACTED] responded to the World Trade Center at 16<sup>th</sup> and Broadway on a report of individuals throwing rocks at the windows.
- 1700 hours The protest group at the **State Capitol** remained small (20-25). They demonstrated peacefully along Lincoln by holding signs and banners.
- 1728 hours [REDACTED] responded to a report of an unattended backpack on W. 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue between Cherokee and Delaware (south side of Headquarters). Checked Clear.
- 1820 hours The **State Capitol** group of around 50 – 100 people left westbound and walked through Veteran's Park, then across Broadway where they disrupted traffic and rallied in Civic Center Park. While in Civic Center Park the group surrounded an RTD security car. [REDACTED]
- 1841 hours The group began marching unpermitted in the street northbound on Broadway, counter flow to traffic and then westbound on Colfax Avenue and into downtown via 15<sup>th</sup> Street.
- 1850 hours The group was at 15<sup>th</sup> and Welton, where they lit some type of road flare. [REDACTED]
- 1855 hours The group turned south on Champa and then north on Speer Boulevard. They immediately changed directions and continued south on Champa, then turned north counter flow in the southbound lanes of Speer Blvd. The group interfered with and walked through heavy traffic at 1905 hours. [REDACTED].
- 1914 hours There was a report that group members damaged a BMW vehicle near Speer and Auraria. [REDACTED] responded for a report (CAD# 17-44086). The group turned west on Auraria Parkway. Auraria Parkway was closed at Speer NB, 7<sup>th</sup> and NB I-25 for safety. [REDACTED].
- 1922 hours The group marched onto Auraria Campus toward 7<sup>th</sup> and Walnut, then moved on 8<sup>th</sup> Street toward W. Colfax Avenue.

1930 hours The group turned west on Colfax Avenue toward I-25. [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED].

1942 hours CMD 6 Commander Saunier made an amplified order for the group to move off the street.

1945 hours [REDACTED]. Commander Saunier gave another amplified warning for the crowd to disperse off the street. After continued disobedience by the protestors, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED], then began walking eastbound at 1953 hours.

2000 hours The group walked westbound in the eastbound lanes of Colfax Avenue. They walked in and around on-coming traffic and then turned north on Speer and counter flow on Champa Street. [REDACTED]

2013 hours Two demonstrators carrying a large black banner that said "F\*\*\* Trump" were warned for a third time to stay out of the street. The group walked on the sidewalk and crossed 15<sup>th</sup> toward the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Mall.

2022 hours An individual was arrested (John M. English 8-7-62) 1500 block Champa by Metro 2 (RDV4) for blocking a police vehicle in the street (CAD# 17-44258). He was charged with Interference, Resistance, and Obstruction of Streets. A Use of Force report was completed (complaint of bruise). The protest group then walked to 16<sup>th</sup> and Champa and began to disperse.
