Identity Evropa orientation for new pledge members January 30, 2019 (exact date unconfirmed)

RUSH TRANSCRIPT:

[00:00:00] Coordinator: Thinking about this channel. So I'm just speaking so you can ensure that I engage, your headsets are set up properly. Patrick will be here in a moment and make sure if you're commenting we're leaving comments or asking questions as Patrick has as ever policy and does your pledge orientation that you're putting things in the Pledge channel so don't put it in in general because he's not going to be looking thank you.

[00:00:32] Patrick Casey: And hello everyone. Welcome to Identity Evropa. Welcome to this week's pledge orientation. I'm Patrick Casey and I apologize for being two minutes late. I'm actually, I woke up incredibly sick today for some reason, so, but, that is not an excuse anyways. So this, the purpose of this orientation is to ensure that new members are fully integrated into the organization. So it entails learning about Identity Evropa of who we are what we do and why we do it. And I'm sure most, If not all of you, have a pretty pretty decent idea of how to answer those questions already. Nevertheless, there are some very important nuances that we need to communicate to you that might be... That you might not be aware of. I mean it's very important for you guys to understand why we do what we do. We're not out just doing this, doing that because we think it might be good or not. Now we've we've been A / B testing everything that we do since the organization started. And so there is kind of a method to this stuff that you see publicly right the activism, the networking, media appearances we've put a lot of thought into this. And it's important for you guys to understand the theory behind what we do.

[00:01:52] So to begin what is IE? IE is an identitarian organization. What does that mean? Identitarianism is about identity above all else. It's a way of seeing the world that emphasizes the role that identity in its many contexts and forms plays in society. Identity is a very contextual thing. It's one person's identity is quite often defined by having an other right? So you know, when throughout most of European history the other was other your, other white people, other, other Europeans and there were definitely bitter rivalies and wars and so forth that were fought between white people.

[00:02:38] But you know with the dawn of the modern world colonization/ slavery as well..it was clear that there was a far wider world out there and that white people actually had quite a bit in common. And if you look globally we absolutely do. So that's where that's basically when the concept of race became more and more significant. So identitarians in Europe tend to focus on ethnicity. There are a few reasons for that. [00:03:09] First of all it's strategic. They get to bypass accusations of supremacism and racism to say no we're just for the German people. And they do have an understanding of race. They have the concept of civilizational identity and that's. But they have to be very careful with how they say what they say due to hate speech laws and just political expediency. [21.1] Now here in America we don't get to do that, right? And that's, you know, that's not necessarily an issue. But in America, because it is a multiracial society, the lines of identity are drawn around race. You know, the conflicts back in Europe between a German and a Frenchman, or a German and an Englishma, no the extent that they even exist today, are basically insignificant here in America. If you're a third generation German, you know are you really going to have issues with someone who's third generation an other ethnic group now who cares about that at this point. It's fun to joke about right. But it's not a real cause for concern.

[00:04:13] So as identitarians we are primarily concerned with racial identity in America. We Are white people, white Americans, Americans of European descent and that's what we're focused on. And because we focus on this, the organization doesn't really take a stance on religion, favorite

form of economics or political organization.

[00:04:32] So people ask is IE...does IE support socialism? I say no. Well does IE support libertarianism? I'll still say no. If you could ask me does IE support, I would say we basically support most, or rather we are open to, most forms of economics that are not, you know, extreme and impractical, right. I don't think you can be, you can really be a white communist. I think that socialism, or communism in the form that Marx and Lenin advocated, is something that is supposed to, you are supposed to put your regional identity to the side. Basically, you're ethnic. Know all of those other identities are supposed to be supplanted by that of your identity as a member of the proletariat. And you could point to examples when perhaps this was until it was it wasn't always clear cut. You know, there were, there was a certain sense of of national pride in the USSR and obviously Stalin purged members of another ethnic group who are not so basically committed to what I think he described as the Russian cause. But anyways, the point is, is you can be, you can favor socialism, libertarianism, almost anything in terms of economics, and still being identitarian, still be welcome in Idenitity Evropa. You can be.. I used to say every religion. [00:05:57] But I quickly want to add that there are many religions that I would not allow it. I don't think that allow in a white Muslim, though we haven't had that issue come up. [8.9] But I don't think that that would be something we'd support. Moreover if you were a Satanist I would tell you I'd probably find something a little more serious to believe in and I would not allow a Satanist in the organization...well-adjusted pagans, Christians, atheists, agnostics people into, I don't know, [inaudible] are welcome in the organization. What matters there is just that people are welladjusted, agreeable, and aren't trying to constantly cause infighting over these these, you know, these issues.

[00:06:42] So because we, we share the same historical identity, because we are, rather I should say because we share the same identity, we share the same historical destiny. And that's a big part of why we focus on white identity and why we are focused on issues that uniquely affect people of European heritage in America. The other side can talk about deconstructing whiteness and they can cite "oh back during the Ellis Island era of immigration the WASPs didn't like the Italians", Yeah, I can see, but not all these historical anecdotes that they want, but the simple fact of the matter is that to the powers that be, to progressives, to most non-whites, the difference between an Italian an Irishman and a German or a wasp is largely largely non-existent. They see, they see a white person, a white boy, right. And that's why we're all in this together. Like it or not. So that is why it's important for us to unite around that role in the same boat. They've put us in the same boat, and of course biologically, historically, we have a lot in common. So, but, we've realized that as people of European heritage, particularly Americans of European heritage, that if something doesn't change in this country as a group, we are going to collectively face a fairly dark future. So we're definitely stronger when we're united, we can say, hey, this organization is now only open to evangelicals or to Odenists or something along those lines, guess what, we'd lose most of the membership. So we're in this together in so far as the Left is against things like, you know, things like Christianity and so forth it's. Yeah. It's true to some extent but there are some forms of Christianity the Left is absolutely fine with, right, forms of Christianity that have been co-opted by progressivism. So at the end of the day it is because we are white. We shouldn't delude ourselves into thinking that they hate us because of this or that, no. It's mostly because we're white.

[00:08:43] So the term identitarian is favored by us because it cuts to the core issue and that is identity. We've just been talking about that would you not use the term alt-right that had a lot of potential was quickly run into the ground and had the potential to be something new something that would be able to be appealing, attractive, and alluring to millennials, zoomers and older generations as well who were coming to racial consciousness in a world that is becoming increasingly hostile to them, to us. And I can tell you briefly an anecdote from my experience, my ideological journey. Back In 2012 was I was mostly there so I was fairly aware of certain racial realities, of the Jewish

influence plays in all of this and what ended up happening as I was like "OK. Is there anything in the real world I could join? Any people I could meet up with? Is there any like movement I could support?" I didn't find AmRen, I didn't find, I don't know, if NPI was relevant then, but the point is, is that I didn't find anything good. What I found was the National Socialist Movement and I remember looking at pictures of these guys and I was like "this is really weird. This is really weird." Like, these people, you know, however well-intentioned they are, like, these aren't people I want to be seen with in public. These aren't people I'd feel comfortable leaving my kids around with.

[00:10:03] I don't have kids, but, hypothetically speaking, and so the point is that the altright...White Nationalism has always existed. Skinhead stuff is basically, by always I mean for as long as we've been alive. Same with the skinhead stuff, neo-Nazi stuff as well. And it failed to capture the imagination and the dedication and royalty of well-adjusted people of European heritage and any large number but when the alt-right came along and I saw Jared Taylor and I saw Henrik Palmgren, back then I saw Richard Spencer and I said these people are reasonable, these people are relatively fairly educated, not that you need to have a PhD or anything, but, you know, these are these are, like, people that are part of society, they're not part of a fringe group because they want to be part of the fringe group. [00:10:48] And the point is is that eventually the alt-right got sucked into the pre-existing white nationalism and Neo-Nazism, you saw that with the inclusion of certain groups and individuals that basically made the alt-right a dead brand, and it is behind the scenes, even some of the people who still use it, they are,, you know kind of aware that it's kind of lost its power, but that's OK. Politics is largely about branding, it's all about branding, but that's why we use the term identitarian, another term that can be used as well is nationalist. I think things like ethno-nationalist or white nationalist are too much in the sense that they just kind of sound weird to the average person. [44.4] I think if you're going to say, now, if you say you're a nationalist, it doesn't necessarily mean you're a civ...It basically means you support strong borders, you support the preservation of your country's historic demographics, and, and you are against globalism. That's kind of what it means in the vernacular at this point. That's why, you know, Steve King, who claims to be a civic nationalist, says I'm a nationalist, right. So in the sense of saying I am a Nationalist, you're basically saying I'm on the side of populism, against globalism, that's good at this point. It's just not specific enough. That's why the term identitarian comes in.

[00:12:05] And I really like how the term identitarian has come along to a lot of people, they might have reservations about it because it's something new, but guys, the term libertarian was new at one point. A bunch lot of intellectuals popularized it...now it's basically a household name. That's, that's what is gonna be as identitarian too. We shouldn't be afraid of new terms. So there's a bit, there's quite a bit of utility and strategic value in referring to ourselves as something new. Because that's what we basically are saying, we're saying we're not the skinheads stuff. We're not the paramilitary white nationalist. No, we're well-adjusted well-intentioned men and women of European descent who want a better world for our people. And we're going to speak unapologetically. [00:12:47] We're not going to speak through a filter, and we're not going to bow down before antifa, leftists, minorities and let them tell us what we can say and what we can believe. [10.1]

[00:12:59] So what is our goal.

[00:13:00] Well, we get asked that quite often and I like to leave it a bit vague, because this is I think the best way of looking at it. Our goal is to improve the quality of life for our people, to create a better world for people of European heritage, for the standing of people of European here heritage here in America. And that could take many forms, and that's why I like leaving it kind of open-ended. Because, you know, you will get out there as are now and I ask each one of you tell me how things could be better. I don't think you would all give the same answer. You could all sure go for 100 percent white ethno--state on the moon or something. And that would be a very specific way of things of how things could be better. It would also be the least practical, the least achievable at this

point. But I'm not against entertaining grandiose notions from time to time. But the point is to say yes, we can all agree we're creating a better world. We want to create a better world for our people. Now you talk about specific policies that could be implemented to make the lives of our people better. You could talk about restricting legal immigration to people of European heritage. You could talk about that. Building the wall. National E-verify system. Deporting illegals. You know, more funding for border security and so forth. Freedom of association is a big, It's a big one that would help mitigate the woes of diversity as it currently stands in America. [00:14:27] Though we obviously want to kind of return America back to its historical demographics, meaning overwhelmingly white. [5.5] But we want to do that legally, nonviolently, and you know humanely, ri,ght and I'm absolutely convinced that can happen and people that want to get it right you know get into LARPING about the kind of cruelty that they would engage in when they have power is just utterly stupid. Without getting into the...perhaps obvious ethical issues there. You look at me, you look at historically, people who do atrocities they don't like brag about it, they say that they didn't do it. They're not like. but You have these like idiots on Gab and so forth and they're like, we're going to load them all up in ships and just set them off by gunpoint, and it's just like "What? Who do you think you're appealing to are trying to win over with this". It's like, it's not the kind of rhetoric that's really going to lead anywhere but [00:15:19] anyways we would absolutely support humane voluntary programs of remigration of repatriation where people who are not of European descent, people who aren't Western, can return to their native homelands. [13.6] Because the simple fact of the matter is, these people, you know, you hear them talk about, like, the insufferable whiteness of this, that, or something else, and it appears that our whiteness is actually a burden for them to have to deal with it. It's an eyesore. [They] just hate how white our country is. And that's, I mean, you talk to many minorities and that's kind of the driving force behind promoting diversity. They don't want to be the only brown person in a room. And guess what, I totally understand where they're coming from but I don't want to be the only white guy in a room, in a city, or a country. So it's at that point that you realize that having different identities quite often means you're going to have diverging interests. And, you know, that's that's kind of why multiracial societies quite often just become a free-for-all, right. It's just like, alright, who's going to realize that it's just kind of a battle for power, the kind of civility that I think was definitely a very good thing in American history is largely gone at this point. And that's, that's too bad.

[00:16:36] But how do we create a better world for our people, how do we actualize some of these, these visions that we have for the future. Well, we need power. I think we all get that. So power is basically the ability to influence or cause change, right? Influence actions or cause and influence events, or cause events to happen, so you could be whispering in the ear of the King or you could be the King himself and directing your advisors and your rulers to go out and do what you say. So power is ability to effect change more than any more than anything else.

[00:17:16] How do you how do you wield power? What, well, what is power comprised of though? Saul Alinsky famously argued that power is the product of two main things: people and money and I think it's a really good way to look at it because you need resources. Those are ultimately forms of capital, though, so I would expand the definition to go, pardon me, to go from just people, money to which are basically human capital, and financial capital to include social capital which is not only just having these select individuals, but having social networks and that is a huge part of what we are engaged in behind the scenes. You know we have people meeting up at least once a week in many chapters. Or quite often, more often, to get together to do things like activism, having dinners, movies, just having a good time. Having a healthy peer group where you can talk about these things, we don't want people to just be isolated in their rooms on Discord talking about the things that they, they hold most dear, that's not healthy. And even for those people who are in that situation, it's not really their fault it's the fault of this Orwellian social atmosphere we live in. So what we need. People need money. [00:18:31] We need social networks. We need property. We need to have lawyers, we need to have massive infrastructure. I mean I see a big part of what we're doing is building infrastructure that is going to be able to advocate for our people. We need to have billions of dollars. We need to have the support of billionaires. [17.6] We need to be a household name. The SPLC brought in, I think, 50 million dollars last year. That's kind of their yearly budget or how much they bring in. But the point is, is that why don't we have that? We don't have that because we haven't earned it. We have to prove it to our people yet that we are worthy of fifty million a year. But guess what? If every white person out there gave us a little bit of money then that would be fairly easy to get. There are a lot of white people in this country, and quite a few white people who are against the left.

[00:19:18] So people ask all what you see IE in ten years what do you see. ...tell me about the future. The future, it's hard to say where things are going. How things are going to play out. But if and when we are given some kind of opportunity, right, the stars align, and I'm saying that jokingly, and something happens in American politics, given a chance. [00:19:38] We should have an organization that has hundreds of thousands of members that has trained activist teams and has lawyers on retainer, just the support of elites, and so forth because capital centralization is a huge thing. [15.9] The reason the SPLC and the ADL and all of these other terrible organisations are able to function effectively is because they get a lot of capital in one place and then when they can direct it at the best or the perceived best causes and once they, you know, obviously having all that capital and directing it in one place is very powerful, and it's unfortunate that that is the case for them, but it's basically up to us to do that.

[00:20:19] So how do we get capital? We need capital. Capital is basically the resources that allow you to effect change and affecting changes as we talked about a few minutes ago is power. Well, activism is the main way that we attract it. When we go out and we create visual displays of defiance against globalism, progressivism and every other -ism that is threatening our people...we are sending a message to the world we're saying that "hey you're against these things? We are the people you need to support. We are the people that are putting ourselves out there. We are risking getting doxxed, we are risking getting attacked by psychotic leftists". That we are more than willing to risk far more than that to achieve our ends to create a better world for our people. And I sometimes see people talking on Twitter and elsewhere as if, you know, activism's some kind of nebulous thing, it's hard to determine whether or not activism actually works. And that's not the case, its not the case at all. Every time we do a large action, we've seen an influx of applications and donations, to people who are really giving us money, giving us money primarily because they like the activism, and they want to see more of it. So that's what, ah, that it is kind of our reason for being. That is what we're here to do.

[00:21:37] And although we also do what we do, community service, too, I think you could probably want that it was activism, but then the second main component of our operations is networking. We talked about that a few minutes ago. So networking refers to building social capital; networking refers to building social capital. The local meetup, right? We also have national, regional level events where people travel all over the country, come out to do activism, to engage in fraternal activity and just to enjoy each other's company. I mean, when you're at one of these AirBnBs when there's 50 to 60 if not more people in the same place, it's high energy, it's a lot of fun. And at our national conference last year, we had upwards of one hundred and fifty. So it's, when you have that many people together in one place, it is, it's just fantastic. The energy is through the roof, and that's the kind of thing that keeps me going. We did that over the last week, we went out to Chicago, demonstrated outside of Mayor Rahm Emanuel's office at City Hall, and it was it was fantastic, and then we went back to a private venue to have, you know, somewhere on 70 people get together and we gave speeches Nick Fuentes, Jared Taylor was there. Obviously there was a good time.

[00:23:01] So those kinds of things that we do pretty often, we actually have something coming up

not this weekend, but the following weekend, and then we have the conference coming up in May, so many good things on the horizon.

[00:23:16] So one more thing about networking is that a lot of people join the organization and they can't do activism or at least they're uncomfortable doing it. That's OK. That's OK. [00:23:26] It's important to note though that in ... err in 2018, less than five people were doxxed and they were basically all doxxed as a result of being careless on social media posting things under their real name liking things under their real name and so forth. And that's how people get doxxed more often than not. It's not someone rats you out. It's not someone sees your face in a crowd. [21.4] Well, that did happen in Charlottesville, but that was definitely an anomaly. You had the whole world looking at pictures of these marchers, and, yeah.

[00:24:01] So basically, a lot of people can't do activism though, again, we've proven that you can show your face and go out there and be a face in a crowd and you probably won't get doxxed. There's no guarantee. But I mean, again, that didn't happen in 2019. I know very few instances when that does happen. But the point is, if a lot of people can't or won't do activism, that's OK. There's no requirement. People have quite a bit to offer behind the scenes as well. And we need some. We need to be able to keep these people. We need to find something to offer. That's why the local meetup is very important.

[00:24:37] So just briefly going through the structure of Identity Evropa, and I apologize for my voice being as it is, hopefully it's not too terrible, there's not much I can do about it. So you have your regional coordinator. Your regional coordinator is in charge of your region, which can be a city, it could be a state. You have staff coordinators. These are people ... staff coordinators are responsible for things like accounting, social media posting and so forth, so we've got quite a few people who are coordinators for those functions. We have moderators. Please be sure to be respectful to the moderators. We'll talk with the server rules and a little bit but it is something we take seriously. We have interviewers with whom you're familiar. We have the Advisory Council which consists of me, Matt, Ian, Identity, Great American and Will K. It is not a shadowy board of, of, you know, mysterious people ruling you from but in the shadows, these are people you'll meet in person in your local meet ups, at national level events and so forth. So it's, it's, it's definitely very open. We also have an open door policy, so if you ever need anything, ever any concerns, please come to me, please come to me. You can message anyone on this serverr there's no guarantee as to when they'll respond. I generally try to get back to people fairly quickly, but there's no harm in not you know reminding me if I forget to respond after a day or two. Then I'm the Executive Director, formerly I was the CEO for that, thought the title was a bit too, was a bit too I was too corporate CEO...that's something perhaps left to the guy in charge of Best Buy not Identity Evropa so, executive director, it was changed.

[00:26:32] Next we're going to go over the membership guidelines. I want you to open up the #guidebook channel that is the seventh from the top. So, there's quite a bit in here. Eventually there will be one document that you will open and read out, but for now, the two that you need to read it we're not going to over both. The first is how we poster. I will briefly talk about that. You need to read this because before you put up a single poster and you should be putting up posters and flyers. It's kind of the bread and butter of our activism and people cite seeing flyers on their application. So it does work. People apply because they saw the flyers and yeah. So if you're not doing it as specified in here we might not be able to use your pictures. You might not do it correctly and you might get yourself in trouble. We don't want you guys getting vandalism charges. As always it's, it's very good to look up the local laws and ordinances in wherever you live to determine whether or not ... whether or not it took a bit of flight or a certain way.

[00:27:37] But I want you to open up the membership guidelines and we are going to be going

through these guidelines contain basically the main expectations we have of you as members and we need to have rules. We need to have standards. Part of the reason why the broader alt-right didn't really work out is because there weren't standards. People could just do whatever they wanted and it was kind of a "screw you dad" attitude, all that. But it's I think it's obvious to everyone that there need to be rules. People need to be held to rules not just in Identity Evropa but also in the workplace, in your family life, and just society in general. There are good ways of doing things. There are bad ways of doing things, right, from a consequentialist perspective. We should be doing things that lead to good results. That is, that, that's basically how we arrive at, how we read these guidelines is just thinking about cause and effect, and making sure that we maximize the people are paving ways that lead to harmonious and fruitful results rather than destructive and discordant. So as a member of Identity Evropa, One, you will read the guidebook and adhere to all rules and requirements outlined therein refers to the guidebook channel read everything in there. Two, you will you will read understand and follow the server. So let's briefly go through these I'm not going to read through all of them. But you are all required to read these. That is the second channel from the top. So things not to do in the server:

[00:29:08] Don't post anything Hitler-related. [0.4] That's not what we're about, and we don't want anyone screen capping anything in this server or making us look bad. No illegal activity. That is probably the biggest one. Obviously I shouldn't have to tell you this. But of course I will. We're not interested in anything illegal or violent. So saying oh we should go beat antifa. Oh we should do this that. I'm not going to get into All of the various absurd and unwanted hypotheticals we could entertain. But the point is is that illegal activity is something that we cannot be engaged in. The main issue here is that people actually suggesting that because most people who made it this far realize it's a dumb thing to do. The issue is people joking about it...Guys look in the court of law saying I was just doing "an irony" your Honor. I was just being ironic your Honor. It does not count, does not count. All these people in Charlottesville who thought they were real edgy when they were. You know the Charlottesville Discord server...these are people outside of IE when they making jokes about running over protesters. Well guess what they see they get their Ddiscord get subpoenaed and you know they get called into you know to be depose. They have to go through a deposition. Guess what you're doxxed at that point. So the spirit of not saying indefensible and stupid things we cannot even joke about violence and we take that very seriously. If you want to work on an edgy comedy routine. You can do it elsewhere.

[00:30:27] Yes so for religion if it gets heated role we'll tell you guys to find something else to talk about. That applies to any topic. It's out of hand. its important for people to stay calm and collected. Those are traits that we absolutely value in this organization particularly leadership. So people come in and think they're cool for being hotheads and you know throwing temper tantrums it's might make you feel powerful but you're just behaving like a big baby at the end of the day. And I've seen countless relationships and projects destroyed because of anger because of egotism and because people just can't you know people take things personally. So those are all unskillful for ways of behaving and those are things that we do not permit on the server.

[00:31:07] So extremism. So this basically means not advocating like violent revolution or advocating national socialism. That's basically I mean it basically summarizes that. Coming into the server saying we need total fascism now is it's gonna make you look a little weird. So just kind of keep it .. you know... We're just not an extremist organization in that sense. [21.0]

[00:31:29] Now are we using the SPL C's definition of extremism. No I shouldn't have to say that but it's it's basically you know we you're in identity Europe but you know what I'm talking about right? But again if you have any questions feel free to reach out and we'll do a Q&A a session at the end of this probably one half an hour to hold your questions until. No weapons don't post anything with weapons. Don't screenshot anything on the server. Don't talk about anything going on the

server to people outside. Vulgar language keep in mind this is a mixed space, you're in mixed [00:32:06] company there are wives and mothers here so coming [3.0] in and talking about a guy talk locker room talk, and if you're going to do that make sure aound only men and chances are you're not.

[00:32:17] Interracial conflict. So just keep in mind that people like jokes like Italians aren't white, Greeks aren't white, Irish aren't white are you might think it's funny but you know if you see like an Italian guy in the server and you say "hey you're not white haha" you've never met him like this person is just going to be like you know it's it's one of those things you don't want to do. Right. If you have rapport with someone you've got a good friend who's Italian and you that's kind of a source of comedy for you guys sure right? I mean I'm I'm Irish. People make people I know personally in person and make those jokes and it's funny and I give it back sometimes but you just have to.. the Bigger issue with this is that people need to realize don't expect that you're not friends with everyone in this organization. You have the potential to be and most people are gonna be really really friendly to you. But with that said don't get too comfortable right. If you're out to meet up and you know you're just like that I love all of these people keep in mind when another man. Well so like you know putting one of them in a headlock as a joke might be seen as like you know who's this guy, why is he put me in a headlock?

[00:33:19] We've had that happened before it's just you know. Imean look when you meet people in IE feel like you've known them for a while you're just totally on the same page not just terms of politics, to talk about that we don't talk about politics that often the person. I mean from time to time we do but it is just like having having a group of friends everyone runs welladjusted and laid back, on the safe wavelength..not taking things personally, intelligent. So you are able to talk about all kinds of subjects but yes. So as a result of that sometimes people do get too comfortable and they just keep in mind might not know someone too well it applys to online too. So I want you guys to read through all of those sort of rules on your own some time for the end of week.

[00:33:57] Three: Do not engaged in any gestures use any language or display any paraphernalia related to Third Reicht. Right. So if you were under the impression that identitarian was just a fancy way of saying National Socialism you're in the wrong place. Sorry. Anything neo-Nazi in America will never work that was you know something like 15 years of another country's history. Rehabilitating that is not our job. It's not our [00:34:20] job. It's not something we're concerned with. You know it's there are definitely two sides to things. There's definitely a narrative peddled by the mainstream academic system in and so forth is always a very hyperbolic end and out of out of touch with reality. But I think the truth lies somewhere in between. [21.8] Plenty of people who don't get quote unquote redpilled arrive at these very erroneous conclusion that Hitler did nothing wrong. And that's that's so wrong. So we're not ...we're not interested in disavowing in this than the other but like a period in here thinking like we need national socialism. Go join the NSM. This is not the place for you. Its never gonna work in America. And you should be advised that who is so eager and ardent with regard to linking any sort any form of white identity to National Socialism, neo-Naziism? It's the other side it's the powers that be. It absolutely is.

[00:35:22] So if they see it as being in their best interests perhaps it is our best interest to not go along with that. Now we'll talk about the optics stuff a little towards the end and how that relates to this. I know that you know what our position is not that we're going to win over the media and make them like us. So I don't want you guys to think that's the our position here.

[00:35:42] But basically anything neo-Nazi.. there's so many white you out there that want a white country, they don't want their kids turned into tranies, don't want to be discriminated against for being white or against black crime. But like do these people want to be Hitler worshipers? No. It's just always going to be a very fringe thing. So the spirit of not being fringe that is what we're

against by against I mean this organization does not promote it. You can have whatever opinion you want on World War 2. Sure I'm not going to be like interrogating you to make sure you see things the same way I do. But yeah. If like you show up to a meetup and are just like "oh god, I love Hitler". People are just gonna be like OK dude". Well all right just going to make you look a little weird. And again it's on the server nothing like that. We don't want it. You want anybody you know heaven forbid someone infiltrate the server. We don't want them like "we're just posting hitler memes".

[00:36:34] Four : You consume alcohol responsibly particularly at IE events. So drink in moderation at IE. You can have a good time. People go out the bar, people drink at the AirBnBs. It's totally fine. But don't. We do not want to babysit you. We do not want you throwing up on on someone's bed. We do not want you doing...you know drunk driving you just we have to we have to represent the best among our people. Hey look I know there's people young everyone's kind of gotten too drunk most likely at some point in their lives. Some learn their lessons, others don't. The point is is that yeah we can't have a culture that just emphasizes drunkenness or [inaduable]. It just a great way for us to destroy everything we've worked for so instead it need a really good time.

[00:37:26] I'm sure you know general fitness,martial arts, reading, activism, healthy community right trying to start [inaduable] and so forth. So keep that in mind. You know don't. That's not the time to test your limits. I understand like you know people are frats in college and they like going wild with drinking by isn't the place for that.

[00:37:50] Five, because this is a co-ed organization you will interact with members of the opposite sex in a respectable manner. I will do it too but I'm reading the guideline to you. So yeah you're in mixed company. We've got somewhere between 15(??) odd women probably closer to 60 70 and the exact number but yes. So first of all be respectful. You don't have to...you xertainly shouldn't be a white knight or anything over the top. But the point is is that there's a lot of work there's a lot of anti-woman stuff in the broader dissident right. That is I think is being peddled by people who are unmarried, don't have kids and that it will never happen. There's a lot of bitterness out there and we don't want our positions on anything be rooted in bitterness. We wanted to restore a harmonious sexual relations, relations between the sexes. And so does that involve women having a more nurturing supportive role. Sure. I mean saying any woman with a job is a whore or something. Just padoying things I've seen on Twitter from weirdos but now obviously that's that's really out of line. You know harassing a woman for not having kids because by the age of twenty five or something it's just, it not cool. We want to encourage people positively in caringly to start families and have good lives.

[00:39:11] This this you know given that there are men and women the organization it's just a given that there will be romantic relationships flowering as a result the networking that we facility we have facilitated one engagement that I'm sure will lead to marriage fairly recent though and one marriage and that marriage has produced a beautiful baby boy. And if we're doing that then that alone is is phenomenal. Then we want to see more of that. I'd like for everyone in Identity Evropa obviously at some point to get married and have kids. Now they're older people who have kind of missed the boat on some of this stuff. This is fine. They're still welcome. We want to be respectful and compassionate towards all of our members and you know bashing people for like oh you're 55 and you haven't had kids you worthless that's not cool.

[00:40:02] My point is here is that yeah if you're in this organization to sleep around it will become apparent pretty early on and probably be asked to leave. It's happened once or twice happened with girls but yes as there are more and more girls in the organization. The opportunity for some guy to come and go and try to sleep as many IE as possible comes along look thats just not what we are about. We want to be practicing what we preach if we're about white people. The future of our

people then we need to be forming healthy families and having kids and kind of pursuing it that way. Yeah. So if you're interested in another member go for it. If you get shot down and you start sulking and being bitter and it can be really obvious to everyone and that that kind of bad blood over some..you Know someone if someone turns you down nicely that doesn't make them a bad person. Just because they made you feel bad feelings that this mission that they're under no obligation to do that. So just keep that in mind I've only seen this happen once but it led to some real sour grapes that spoiled things for everyone involved. So just keep that in mind. Also again IE spaces are mixed company. Do not talk... I mean don't talk about vulgar things around, I mean it goes for both men and women ladies. Some things are not ladylike to discuss around men and men some things are not I guess gentlemanly to discuss around women. So if you have any doubt as to the kind of things I'm talking about you can ask me that I think you probably get it.

[00:41:28] Six: when representing Identity Evropa you will dress appropriately. Under no circumstances wear masks military uniforms or other bizarre attire. So this straightforward we're not a paramilitary organization. You know you get people that listen to a bunch of podcasts and they're like I'm a of a warrior for the White race and they when they want to show up to meet ups and conferences and like combat boots and camouflage and it's really goofy. We have distinguished military veterans in this organization. They're the ones that you know are the least inclined to do that. So when they see civilians doing that it's just incredibly you goofy guys. Don't do that. We are well-adjusted people of European heritage. We're part of society and we want to appear attractive and appealing and the way we do that is by not playing into stereotypes and by looking like people that the average well-adjusted person would want to be around. So does that mean you have to wear a suit all the time. No. In fact don't wear a suit all the time don't put a flyer you don't wear a suit. I would say dress for the occasion. If you're going to a conference, you're going to a speaking engagement coat and tie. You can't go wrong with that. If you're going to go out do activism you can wear a tie too. You can wear a button up you know in that case business casual, smart casual is fine. You can wear jeans and a T-shirt when you go to activism make sure it fits well make sure it's nice. Don't Wear like a Metallica shirt and dirty jeans or something. So just a lot of it's contextual. But you know the idea that you have to always be wearing like Brooks Brothers is something is... It's absurd. That's not what we do and we don't spend that much time thinking about like optics, it's kind of a personal thing. It's like it's dressed like this we normally just for the occasion. And if you ever have any doubts as to how you should dress beyond this guide feel free to reach out to ever organizing the action. Feel free to reach out to your coordinator.

[00:43:28] Seven: You accept that religious differences exist within the organization you will behave respectfully towards other members of other faiths in your own. So that's pretty straightforward. We've been over that just don't be infighting don't think things personally don't say cool things. You know if someone else is harassing you over your religion let your coordinator know that person's out of line. How you lose you know I mean just in general if someone's doing treating you poorly if someone is totally out of line. Be the bigger man. Turn the other cheek so to speak. And by that I mean just don't let it get to you. And then we'll let someone known we'll handle it. The worst situations are the ones in which someone does something wrong and the other person responds by doing something wrong. Because it's like OK now I have to deal with both two people who have screwed up and the situation becomes less clear cut. This is just kind of a life lesson in general someone's victimizing you, is treating you like crap and you just kind of get into the mud with themt hen you end up maybe you end up saying something worse right. Doing something worse then you're going to lose a lot of your perceived legitimacy and righteousness in that situation.

[00:44:36] Eight: You will respect the authority of your coordinator work with him rather than against around him when it comes to planning activism / community events. I would love for all of you go to your coordinator and say I want to help out. Tell me how. Tell me what I can do with the

local chapter. Tell me what I can do in terms of activism, in terms of organizing. Whatever else. And but you need to work with him rather than against your around him don't plan events without telling your coordinator you need to you need to work with them. So the regional coordinator has the final sign off on everything that happens in your region.

[00:45:05] Nine: You'll see not only your own personal identity but that of other IE members. Pretty straightforward if you get doxxed chances are it will be because you were sloppy. Be careful of where you're anywhere where your real name is online. There should be absolutely nothing dissident politically. Even if you think liking like you know the Red Elephants or Nick Fuentes is, "oh he's just a Trump sup[porter]..." None of you see it that. Right. And it takes very little to gin up a mob for a witch hunt. I don't want you guys wanting to do that. Same thing with your face. Can you give use face online? In a political context...probably shouldn't. With that said if you're going out and doing activism that's a little different. But you know having a face to tie to a social media account is the something too. More over, it's your responsibility to ensure that your actions so result in the boxing of another member members so yeah be very very very careful with any pictures you have of IE people and guys it's totally ok hey I don't want a picture to be taken. Or can delete that picture you just took and so forth but you don't know be responsible for doxxing someone else you'll feel terrible. But as part of this, do not under any circumstances assume that someone is ok with having their name be out there. So it someone applies under the real name and they send you like their faculty page for or you know here's my normie social media don't go out and say "hey this person apply to IE". Don't do it. Don't say "this person in IE". No no no no no. Always or would never assume when it comes to OPSEC. Always ask, always verify.

[00:46:40] Ten: you will not engage in violence, particularly during activism. We're not a violent organization. We engage in violence and the FBI is going to own us and that's pretty straightforward. They're gonna own you. And we've seen that happen with other groups. So I actually don't think that active violence actually helps our cause at all at this point the idea we're just gonna fist fight our way to you know a better world is just not the case. It's not the case now self-defense reserves reserve for extreme situations comes up to the shove. You don't punch them in the face you're going to be involved in a very lengthy legal and destructive legal process and you will get doxxed as a result. So you want to stay out of court. This is kind of a general guys like in life in general to someone could come up and drunkenly like slap you in the face view. Knock him out and he hits his head and gets it like some kind of injury there's a good chance you'll just like you'll be the one who gets in trouble. Self-defense stuff isn't as clear cut as you think. A lot of it depends on the state and so forth. But the point is you'd want to be in the court of law particularly someone who has you know trying to maintain their anonymity and OPSEC. Well you know in relation to these views you just don't want to do it. And we are going to keep you out of it.

[00:47:56] 11: you were refrain of carrying weapons particularly guns and knives during activism. Yeah. You don't need guns or knives to do IE activism. We're not going to take you to the hood to just pass out flyers to get people for hours on end. Right. That that would be reckless. We're not going to go....some operations some active you know activism things events rather might be done in you know a more left wing area in that case you have to be extra careful. But if you shoot or stab someone in this I did probably doesn't matter what the context was ... they'll probably never give us the benefit of the doubt. So we don't want that to happen if you don't feel safe leaving the house or doing that you know doing anything without a weapon or a gun. You know any kind of weapon then just don't do activism. OK. There are other people who are more than willing to do it. And again it's not a requirement.

[00:48:46] 12: You only engage in legal activism. Everything we do has to be legal. If it is ilegal again the Feds are going to come in and destroy us. And they're looking for [00:48:55] excuses. But the reason why we've asked you to stay above water and not only grow in light of Charlottesville is

largely because we've made it very clear we are legal. We're not violent. We're not committing crimes we're not interested in violence. [15.6] So just keep that in mind.

[00:49:12] Thirteen: you will constantly strive for self-improvement. Straightforward stuff. I want to see ever from bettering themselves the better you are as individuals the better, assett you will be through the cause and the I mean just think of human greatness historically. Think of how much one highly developed, highly intelligent, highly skilled individual can do. They can have massive effects right. So I want all of you reading on you know self betterment, improving yourself, making sure you got more money, better relationships, your smarter, you're in better shape the physical stuff pretty important too. If you don't have an exercise routine you absolutely need to do that kick people out of the organization from being overweight and I will continue to do it if needed.

[00:49:54] Fourteen: you understand that membership and identity Euvropa is exclusive with that of other similar organizations. You'll only participate in IE activism. So many other groups are doing activism out there and it isn't a right. But basically we want to do what we do the best we don't have to have hostility or black bad blood towards other groups but we kind of are doing things on our own on our own. And yes. So just when it comes to this just ask your coordinator if you can do something something like you know can I go hold up signs with TPUSA. If you want to do that you can. But you know could be if say TWP were still around you go and do stuff with TWP, no no. So when in doubt just ask.

[00:50:38] Fifteen...

[00:50:47] OK so real quick. So on 14 this also refers to membership right with other organizations first activism and membership. So you can't join another one of these organizations as well but get "suits for Trump", local birdwatching club. These things are fine but if it's you know political and dissident political in nature you should check with your coordinator first.

[00:51:06] 15 Your present identity Evropa and identitarian in a positive manner. Yeah. So just any advocacy or participation in any form of supremacy violence or illegal activity or otherwise ethically suspect behavior is prohibited. Right. You got to keep in mind everywhere you go you're representing IE as long as you're in IE. If you go off and do something crazy and it comes out turns out that you're in IE that's gonna make us look bad. If you go to AmRen and you drink too much and you throw Jared Taylor's and you're in IE well guess Jared Taylor isgoing to send me an email saying "Mr Casey is one of your guys threw up all my shoes" and I'm going to look like a real idiot. Sodespite the specificity of that example it's never happened and I don't want to. So just keep that in mind when you're at these events, even when you're not, you're representing IE. you need hold yourself to a high standard. All right. That concludes the guidelines. I'm going to go over a few things that will go into the queue and eight in 10 minutes here.

[00:52:15] So what can you do now. Well what you need to do is I want you to be as active as possible; showing up is the most important thing. Show up to every event that you can. It'll be worth it. It's OK to just treat this organization, treat membership herein as as you know that as of say the NRA you pay certain amount a monthto be a member. There you go. You don't do anything. But within this organization we we definitely encourage that. That's OK. That's OK. If you are only going to if you're gonna treat this just as kind of like a membership thing where you don't show up and so forth. Tell your coordinator tell your coordinator so he knows their way you're not showing up to events not because he's doing something wrong. But guys showing up to meet ups is the best thing that you can do. You know don't assume that people are going to be there. Don't assume it's going to be a great meetup if you don't show up. Your way of thinking the way I think when I drive two hours to my closest meet up once a week is that's two hours each way is if I don't show up no one else is. If I don't show up it's gonna be small and lame meet up and I need to be there and that's

not because I'm awesome or something like that. That's what I was thinking before I took over basically don't assume that there's going to be a huge group because other people are going to be thinking it too. We need everyone thinking I need to be there. Show up to meet ups show up to community, show up to activism, show up to the national level events. Right. Got something going on in Utah the weekend of February the 8th. We have the conference our national conference on in March. Gonna be AmRen in May. I'm going to be speaking there. We're going to have a lot of people it can be a great time. We created a lot of recruited people from including a few different coordinators from AmRed last year.

[00:54:00] So beyond that I want you to go to your coordinator and ask him what you can do to help. He will delegate things to you if you want to distinguish yourself as someone who's who's actually interested in making things better for people and you should do that, have initiative be is self starter. And if you don't have that quality as a person now's a great time to develop it. That's one of the best ways to rise up and in any endeavor that you're working in. In your job right? You might be unaware of the fact that ever maybe everyone thinks that you're just kind of you know you're not the kind of person who is the quality of leadership. Right. Quite often making a lot of money entails being a leader to some extent.

[00:54:39] So have initiative, have drive if you don't have that now now's a great time to develop it. But I want you all to be very conscious of how your actions however small affect the whole right? So Look at it this way. You rarely in football...Let's go with chess. In chess you don't win because you move one piece right. You can't win on the first move. It's just impossible you can win and a few moves on doing some kind of cheesy blitz strategy. But the point is that you it's you have to do a number of good moves. Even if you're not doing a move that doesn't take a piece you're still setting yourself up for victory. And that's what we're doing. Every time we put up a flyer, every time you put up a flyer, every time you show up to an event, every time you do something that furthers the growth of this organization in this movement more broadly... You are ensuring that we take one step further to the finish line because again we need power? Capital? How do we get our capital. How do we get capital? Activism and networking so you can help us out with that. Put up flyers you're absolutely going to you will bring in people with from the flyers that we put up. Absolutely. And it's just important for you...the rreason I'm telling you this is that it's important for you to see how your actions matter. We don't want people getting blackpoilled. We want people seeing and understanding and consciously accepting the fact that there are things that you can do to push back against globalism. [00:56:08] We don't have billions of dollars at least not yet. [2.0] We're punching well above our weight class nonviolently. And it's just really important for you guys to understand your actions matter because if you think God can't do anything. It's Nothing I do... why flyer. You know that you're not going to do anything and you're going to grow despondent and you're going to be useless to your people. You want to look your kids in the eve in 20 years and say I did nothing I did nothing. No you don't. That's why you're here. You're here because you understand that if we don't do something nothing is going to change that is becoming clearer than ever now with the dreadful state of the Trump administration. Won't go too big of a tangent there but this is kind of waking people up to the fact that the dissident right is absolutely vital. We are building networks of some of the most intelligent dedicated high quality people in America among our people. You know I've met some of the best and the worst people in the dissident right in my life. And the best the best of those are the ones who are here for the right reasons.

[00:57:14] They're like ya they're able to undo the conditioning they're able to exit the Matrix so to speak and they say hey I've got to do something about that. I have to make a sacrifice that's heroic. You're saying you are taking sacrifice by joining this organization. [00:57:28] Now again the doxxing stuff is fairly rare but it does take a certain degree of idealism to say I am going to sacrifice my time, energy, and money to fight for the cause and that is absolutely fantastic that we have

people who are willing to do that. [17.4] Now on the other side of the spectrum the people who are the worst I've met these are people because they're here because it's bad. They're here because it's bad. And I think Atomwffen is the best...I Don't consider the part of our movement or anything they're deranged lunatics but they're a perfect example of people who are here for the wrong reason. Attraction to the bad, attraction to the vulgar, attraction to that which is perceived to be wrong is kind of you know. our Values were inverted right. And we're trying to we're trying to invert them. Sure. But the you know there is something very very wrong about you've got to be very careful when you say what is right is actually wrong and what is wrong is actually right. Because if you're acting because in our case we are correct. love for our people and advocacy for our people we that used to be good that it was inverted and we're trying to invert it again and revert it I guess and to say no it's actually good but this is you have a lot of people who are trying to do things that again are bad or wrong whenever that is a very dark road to go down. You're getting awful on transgression and a little transgression to your [inaudible] That's your primary motivating factor. You see what happens in Atomwaffen.

[00:58:59] People in their server posting about child pornography posting about Satanism and I mean I guess at some point you're Neo-nazism just doesn't cut it. It's not edgy enough. The point is is that yes there is there are a lot of people in this who come to right wing views for the wrong reasons and we need to stay well away. These people go off the deep end. I'm not just referring to Atomwaffen. There are plenty of other people in the you know your average fash goy meetup who are just you know have serious issues that they should sort out before trying to save the world.

[00:59:32] I mean it's it's kind of cliche at this point but what Jorden Peterson says with cleaning your room before at least before you do anything else is absolutely important. Now if your room's fairly clean you can continue to clean it as you're working in IE. And in fact I think I facility quite a bit of room cleaning. People have definitely proved themselves quite a bit in his organization and that's I think that's the fourteenth guideline. That's exactly what we're going for so I'd say a few things real quick and then we'll go into the Q and A.

[00:59:59] First of all GOP Entryism isn't one of our main things. I had a member recently who thought that that was the case. There are a lot of people. Well there are many. There are very few people on Twitter and so forth who just have a grudge against us for petty reasons and they're trying to say that we are. Our whole goal is our whole goal is supporting the GOP. It's not the case. There was a time in early 2018 where I was more open to that kind of stuff and look I think it's good for us to run in Republican circles to recruit. We've actually had success with that to spread identitarian ideas. Sure we want to be influencing things bringing people in but our main strategy is not trying to take over the GOP. People get involved in politics and generally are doing it on its own and I'm apprehensive about that strategy being successful. We need to build our own infrastructure. We need to build our our own version of the SPLC right. Maybe it's gonna be a hybrid of the SPLC and something else because we're not just a legal thing but we need dissident infrastructure.

[01:01:00] That's our role to play in this. And so moving on to the question of optics. Optics It's the optics thing really just look the kind of the way you present is going to attract certain people. And again we want those well adjusted people we want those people here for the right reasons. We don't want misfits. We want people that are just unable to relate to society I mean I have sympathy for these people but people those people have a lot of problems guys and those are the ones that want to suit up and where the Stahlhem march down the street giving salute. [96.8] It's just goofy it is basically a cult, it has no real world no relation to America no relation to society. it Is something anachronistic and alien and outlandish and our people see it that way they don't want to join some weird cult, they want a white country. Many of them do. And so look at the idea that we should just be working with anyone and everyone, no. If We have a very big tent approach we will scare away the people we need because the well-adjusted people don't want to be around people who are doing

drugs, people who are on you know just just frankly poorly adjusted, poorly socialized but we won't feel comfortable introducing your girlfriend to or leaving around your kids right.

[01:02:20] And there are so many people have joined this organization because we took a different path after I took over. Not just because of me. Everyone else in leadership is on board. But the point is is that every now and then there is this kind of miss you know misplaced sentiment where people say oh we should just invite anyone and everyone in as long as they pro-white guys. That's not the right way to do that. We've tried that and it fails because you're not gonna get the well-adjusted white people out there who just want a better world for our people. Those people are willing to contribute when it's not exciting when it's not transgressive. [37.6] You know we absolutely love going out and doing activism where we shout our views to the world and we're defiant and it's high energy. If haven't done it you should do it at least once. It's a massive adrenaline rush. You don't really understand it until you know the night before and then the morning off and here's like we're going out and through this. But the point is with all of that is that you know, you need more often than you need people who are gonna do paper or fill out paperwork and do a lot of boring stuff behind the scenes. It needs to be exciting from time to time but in a lot of the stuff needed to run an organization is boring. That's a simple fact of the matter. Most of my contributions this organization consists of me sitting in my living room on a tiny computer. I wish I could do demonstrations every day is just not how it is.

[01:03:48] So look the optics thing we need to win over well-adjusted white people. If you allow the misfits in you allow the people who just aren't the most well-adjusted you're going to scare away...there are far well-adjusted people than misfits. So that's how it is. That was everyone outside of IE a misfit? Is it absolutely not. No I'm on good terms with with most though not all. Most almost everyone in the broader dissonant [01:04:14] right. And that's not because I'm I just I'm I have no interest in drama. I have no use for it. Peter Briemlow, Jerry Taylor, AmRen, Red Ice, you know even TRS [The Right Stuff] guys and others I'm on good terms with them. You know some of the stuff that those respective groups do in terms of their messaging and so forth isn't good for us. We have our own niche but there's no use to having you know being hostile and so forth. But again I just want you guys to understand optics is about appealing to our potentially sympathetic audience. It is about killing two people we want to recruit and that's why people who recognize that their country is being taken from them. I thought about making the media like us it's not about making the establishment like us talk about making leftist us like us. People still accuse us of that and it just goes to show that they don't comprehend where we're coming from. And beyond that optics and presentation and messaging really it's just again the bigger thing is that it's a witness test or rather it's a heuristic to determine who the well-adjusted people are who are here for the right reasons and who the poorly adjusted people who are here for the wrong reasons. [71.2]

[01:05:26] And with that I will leave you with a call to action get involved in your chapter, find out the next meetup. Go there. If there isn't one tell your coordinator you want one. Plan one,work with them but again show some initiative. If you don't have that quality in yourself if you're not someone who has drive for this which is arguably the most important thing happening not that you're historically not to you may be your your job is and I totally get that but point is is that if you're not going to have initiative to save your people you really aren't have it in other areas of your life.
