

Rush transcript (made from an incomplete recording of the meeting):

[Recording begins].

Patrick Casey [00:00:00] ..it's gonna be a great time, you guys. This is, you don't want to miss this one. It's gonna be the first action we have at around the HQ and I'm looking forward to seeing you there. Looking forward to inviting you into, it's not just my home, it's the organization's home, and ensuring that this second organization, the second action that we do in this organization is as good or even better than the first. Absolutely.

Patrick Casey [00:00:25] So how you sign up for this is you send thirty dollars to the Zelle earmarked, let's see here, figure this out real quick. Again, I don't know if the organization is going to be making any money off of this. So if you're thinking oh, 30 dollars, why, why is, again that's basically going towards food and it might not even be enough. But I think we'll be good. So other than that, and actually we have a few, we have at least one local female member who I think would be enthused about the idea of cooking for everyone one of these nights. So if any ladies are coming out there and they want to assist with that, more than welcome, it's not gonna be required, we're not gonna force you, we're not gonna confine you to the kitchen. But you know, if you have cooking skills and you wanna put them to use, I think that would be a great way to save money, right, because it's, it's, save money when you buy the ingredients yourself and do all the hard work yourself, but also I think the food quite often is better than you know maybe just going out getting takeout or something, something similar. So I want to see what the DC action will come out, I promise we'll come up with a better name for it than 'the DC action'. But, you know, with IE, that totally separate organization that's so far in the past that I don't even see how people could link to what we're doing now, but, you know, in IE we, we did a lot of, you know, defend blank, defend blank, and I like that, I like that idea, we're just not going to be doing that with the new organization because it's something separate, so we're gonna be coming up with, you know, different names for each individual action. But again, weekend of the 28th and so forth.

Patrick Casey [00:02:10] So another thing as well is, if you haven't been vetted in person, well, I'm not sure if you'll be able to come. We can see about getting you vetted in person before then. But we just want to make sure that, you know, in the spirit of ensuring that every action, [inaudible] honestly in the spirit of ensuring that what happened a month or two ago, basically a month ago at this point, doesn't happen again.

Patrick Casey [00:02:36] So we wanna make sure that everyone who gets an invite to any conference, any event any anything has been vetted in person. And that's going to be a new standard that is going to be held for, for pledges, they're going to have to get vetted in person before they get into the regional and the national server. Now for people who live in Alaska or something, we'll figure something out. But it's, you know, it's got to be something that we basically implement going forward.

Patrick Casey [00:03:07] So other than that, let me see if there's anything in this list here.

Patrick Casey [00:03:13] So let's talk about MatterMost. So, MatterMost is our new national communication server. The way that MatterMost works is you set up a server that you host yourself, so again we are, we are hosting all of this, we can't be kicked off of this

is, I mean, I guess, I guess theoretically if our host or our domain or whatever, you know, the website services that we're paying for, if those remove us then yeah, that's, it's a bigger issue, that's a deeper issue.

Patrick Casey [00:03:36] But with MatterMost, we're hosting it ourselves, matter, where the point is MatterMost isn't going to come in and kick us off, it's not like Discord. So basically you have the server, which is basically all of our, it would be like if Discord is our server, right, Discord is our server and then each server in Discord is a team. That's how it works. So the teams in MatterMost are what we refer to in the past as servers. So we have one server set up, and then we have the national team, the coordinators team, also the leadership team, we have chapter leaders we don't have coordinators [inaudible] and, and then the regional teams as well. So those are, those are what we have. And if you haven't been invited by your coordinator you should go to your coordinator and ask him to invite you. If you haven't been vetted in person, then you're going to have to get vetted in person before doing that. Again, some people I know and have worked with quite a bit have been grandfathered in, but that's going to basically be at my discretion. And if you live, like, you know less than an hour from your coordinator and you say you can't, you know, sorry.

Patrick Casey [00:04:48] We're going to be announcing a secondary, I'm sorry, a tertiary tier of membership sometime in the next month. It going happen sometime in April, where basically, these are for people who want to support the cause, but don't want to, or rather can't, participate and go to, and go to things. So that tier of activism, I'm sorry that teir of, already, I don't know if we're going to call it membership quite yet. It might just be called being a supporter or a subscriber. It's gonna be maybe pay seventy five dollars a year and you get a weekly newsletter just for subscribers and, and so forth. So the people that just can't come out to things, it might be better for them to just do that. When I say come out of things, I mean people who, just not people who have been to things in the past, but can't go to things in the future, the people who sign up and there like, I'm not going to anything in person, those are the people for which, you know, better for them to be supporters or subscribers. So just please keep that in mind.

Patrick Casey [00:05:40] But anyways, once you get added to the, your regional team, then it's very easy once someone joins any team on our server, a small amount of people including myself have the ability to add them to any other team. It's very straightforward. This is actually, you know, MatterMost is similar to Slack, it's the most similar to Slack out of, you know, it's more someone with Slack than it is to Discord or anything else. But it's actually a lot better than Slack. It was an immense...

Patrick Casey [00:06:12] I'm being told that I'm robot-ing. I will give it a second.

Patrick Casey [00:06:41] Alright. I'm, I think I'm going to transfer, you guys I think hop on my phone. I don't know if I'm still robot-ing. Let's see if, Conway, why don't you tell me if I'm still, still robot-ing.

Patrick Casey [00:06:57] Test. Testing. Sounds good now. All right. Thank you. And please message, you guys can message me on here or send me a text message if you have my number if I start robot-ing, please send it right away, I'll switch to my phone if need be.

Patrick Casey [00:07:09] Basically, how MatterMost is once you're in one of the teams it's very easy add you to other teams and your DMs are the same across all the teams. That was something that drove me insane about Slack is I had a different set of DMs with a lot

of the same people according to which Slack team I was, I was looking at. So that was just totally insane. It was a nightmare. But the DM system works, on MatterMost, works similarly to that of Discord where, if you're on MatterMost, if you're on our server, it's the same DMs with the same people. So here's, it's you should, you will be receiving your invoice for MatterMost via email. Don't click the URL, click the Join Now. Then you'll be prompted to create an account, create a username to password, and obviously write that down, and you will go from there.

Patrick Casey [00:07:55] I've been told that using the URL columbia dot, I don't have it on hand, but basically, you have the URL for our, I actually do have it on hand, give me a sec.

Patrick Casey [00:08:36] It's going to take too long. But basically, click the Join Now and that is what will work. As far as the app goes, it's not MatterMost Classic, it's just MatterMost. And again you're going to have to be vetted in person unless you're granted an exception if you want to be added to the national server.

Patrick Casey [00:08:54] So if you haven't been vetted in person now's a great time to contact your coordinator. If you don't have a coordinator in your, in your chapter, or sorry, a chapter leader, if you don't have a chapter leader for whatever reason, we're working on addressing some of these gaps in leadership, in local leadership, then I want you to go ahead and send me an email at pmcasey89@gmail.com and you can find that in the announcement up here. And I'm going to look into adding people who don't have, you know, the coordinators or chapter leaders to handle it. But again it's, it's, you know, it's gonna be hard if no one's met you, if you've never been vetted, you've never came out anything, and we're not gonna turn your way but we're gonna have to sort something else out.

Patrick Casey [00:09:37] I want to thank you guys for the patience while we get all of this stuff set up.

Patrick Casey [00:09:41] We could've just set up another Discord server, we could've just set up another Slack server, or actually, you know what, we did set up a few Slack servers after we were kicked off and they kicked us off right away. We couldn't have done that. We could fly under the radar on Discord until someone else ratted us out or something. But obviously we're just kind of building infrastructure at that point on, on a faulty foundation and we can't do that. So, given that MatterMost is something that we're setting up, that, that our CTO is doing phenomenal work customizing, and he's doing a lot of the coding and all of that good stuff. Then I'd say we need a little more work but we're already adding people and we've got a good amount of people in there. We're going to, you know, I think by the end of next week we should have most people on there, if not sooner. I apologize for giving you guys the 48 hours figure, that was a bit optimistic, but we are, we are hard at work getting you guys in and we'll be done as soon as possible.

Patrick Casey [00:10:39] But anyways it's, I'm pretty pleased with it. Now regarding the voice functionality, that is something that we're going to work towards in the future too. I don't know of anything that, I mean our CTO has told me that there is, you know, he's confident that he'll be able to set up something suitable in terms of voice functionality for hundreds of people. Right. Because I mean you have Skype, you have, use conference call software, you have, I don't know, Zoom and all this stuff. But we need something where hundreds of people can join and participate in voice, right? And as for now on Discord this works fairly easily. So I think we'll do it, we're going to do this for the foreseeable future, until we have something else sorted out. I'd like to remind you guys

that Discord is not doxing people. We were, the people who are out there saying Discord doxed us, I guess their argument is that Discord also released our Slack, Slack servers, right? Obviously that's not the case. You know, people like Matt Heimbach who're having trouble, trouble figuring things out, are still grappling, you know, grappling with this very simple fact. But, you know, the fact of the matter is that we'll be using this for the time being. Not this server, I'm going to delete this server right away, and you will receive an invite 15 minutes before the next weekly address as well. So just keep that in mind.

Patrick Casey [00:12:05] I'm going to be taking questions in a few minutes here from the #general. You can, if you're in how about this. If you're in the national MatterMost server, please tag me in your question in #general. Don't do it just yet, wait 'til I ask. So real quickly, again thank Gimlet for this.

Patrick Casey [00:12:30] So if you receive the invite link, again, you want to click join now but when you're putting in the URL for the server to join, it's always just gonna be <https://columbia.americanidentitymovement.com>.

Patrick Casey [00:12:47] You'll have the links so don't worry about trying to like memorize it or anything. But the point is is that there's going to be, you get invited to a regional server, so your regional team, there's gonna be a slash something at the end, take the slash something off and just use this, I will post it uh, in here before I forget because that was an issue that people had too. But I think the biggest issue was people were clicking the URL and not the join now. Click Join Now. It's a nice big blue button. And I understand the confusion. I think I actually was confused a bit too setting this up, so I don't think you're an idiot, you're absolutely not, jumping around between all of these different communication platforms can be a bit, a bit daunting, and each one has its own learning curve but I think that we are, I like what I'm seeing from MatterMost. So thank you. Also just kind of a small funny thing until we fix this. There is an inability to have a channel on MatterMost that is read-only, so announcements on any server is going to be read-only unless you're a coordinator. And even on the national server [inaudible] for coordinators, sorry chapter leaders, I will refrain from posting anything unless they ask but yeah, on the national server, the, the channel that says read, any channel that says read-only is obviously read-only but there is a character limit. I was one character short of writing announcements read only. So just keep that in mind. You guys can post in there, it's possible, but we're going to be a little upset with you, so please just, please just honor that.

Patrick Casey [00:14:25] I'd like to remind you guys too, on any server, going forward, any identifiable personal information, we are going to treat that as an offense, you are committing an offense against the cause, against the organization, and against yourself, right. But that's kind of, I mean, I guess that's kind of your life to do what you want with it, but guess what, no it isn't. We're gonna be more paternalistic going forward so that these things don't happen. That's why I put it in the handbook for the old organization. Sorry, the guidebook we call it, no, guidelines, guidelines, the guidelines, one of the guidelines was take your OPSEC seriously, take other people's OPSEC seriously, go forward. So one of the main things is don't talk about details about your life, where you went to school, what you do for work, what city, maybe what city you live in exactly, don't talk about what your girlfriend does for a living, right. We're gonna have a way to, yeah sometime within the next month basically, we're going to have it built into our MatterMost, all of our MatterMost teams, that messages delete after a few days. And after we have that then we don't have to worry too much about people, they'd have to be very attentive to come in and screenshot everything like basically in real time. But nevertheless, we just don't, don't give them anything, right. Don't, treat this almost like a public space, right. You

know, if you are on Twitter under a pseudo anonymous account would you be talking, would you be saying oh my my wife went to this college and she does this for it. No, don't say that. Don't say what country she is from. Right. If your wife's from Estonia. How many people in your city have married women from Estonia. Right. These are just, just any personally identifiable information is best discussed, you know, you can, this is what the local chapter's for, right, when you meet people in person, that's when you can talk about these things, or shoot DMs, whatever. And ultimately at the end of the day, some of it is up to you, but it's going to be up to us to ensure that personal information isn't posted, right. These are our main two, the two things that we can do to prevent to just ensure that the chaos that happened a few weeks ago and is kind of still ongoing, doesn't happen again, are, number one, reduce the risk of an infiltration. We've taken a number of steps to ensure that it's harder to get it in, right. It's gonna be harder to gain access to the regional and national servers, but beyond that a lot of it is, is ensuring that even if someone does get in, the damage won't be done, or to minimize the damage done to put it simply.

Patrick Casey [00:16:52] So that concludes everything that I wanted to say.

Patrick Casey [00:16:59] That concludes everything I wanted to say. So you can send me a message here on Discord and I will answer it. You can also send me a, why don't we just do that. Why don't we just do that. Send me a message here on Discord so I'm are not looking between Discord and MatterMost and so forth.

Patrick Casey [00:17:15] But while you guys are typing out your questions, I want to let you guys know that despite everything that we have faced I think we've emerged from all of this stronger, we're stronger than we were before.

Patrick Casey [00:17:28] Most of us have been put through the gauntlet, right? I can tell you that leadership was absolutely put through the gauntlet, right. Launching this new organization draw, you know, trying to host this conference as the locations getting dropped, and people are getting doxed, and people are scared of, that they could get doxed, right, that was, that was probably the most trying week of my life. In fact I absolutely think it was in terms of external challenges. And the fact that we made it through that and we still have an organization, that we pull off a great conference, and great action, is a testament to the quality of people that we have in this organization.

Patrick Casey [00:18:04] Now it's not saying we're better than people outside of the organization. No, we're just really good people we, we have a lot, we have a lot of potential as an organization and that's great. And I'm very honored to be able to do this professionally, to do this as a living, to fight for our people, for our cause, alongside all of you.

Patrick Casey [00:18:20] I want you to know that I understand some people got scared off, I think we'll be able to get them back. I don't think most people were, particularly I don't think most active people were scared off.

Patrick Casey [00:18:30] I want you to remember if you keep your personal information off of the internet, off of all the servers, you don't have, you know, someplace where someone can just find out where you work, right, then you can, and we can absolutely participate in this, in this struggle, in this battle for our people, while still holding, you know, having families, having lives and so forth. I don't know if any of you are out there saying, you know, you want to be public. You think people should be public about this stuff. Don't do that unless you have a long term economic, you're independently wealthy, you have a

business that no one can touch, and there are fewer people under these circumstances than you might think, then come to me and make it a controlled thing. But you should either be fully public or fully private. Now, fully private doesn't mean you don't do activism, it means like your personal info, again, is offline. So just keep that in mind, guys, we have to figure out a way for people to fight back against the injustices that are being perpetrated upon us, while, again, still having lives. Now if people do get doxed, life goes on. There's a lot of variation and in doxes, some people undergo no consequences, other people undergo quite a bit. But you know what, you always bounce back, you don't starve to death, right, you don't hear of people with PhDs you know just dying in a ditch because they can't get a job after getting doxed, but you know, it can be quite trying sometimes.

Patrick Casey [00:19:50] So anyways I'll go to questions.

Patrick Casey [00:19:52] Menace of the Red - isn't a question but can you send me the Zelle link I should send dues to? There are lots of e-mails and it's confusing.

Patrick Casey [00:19:57] Thank you. If you check announcements, you should be able to see it in there. But it is treasury at American Identity Movement dot com.

Patrick Casey [00:20:07] Flying Dutchmann - Given the leftist, the leftist infatuation with Aiden it's only fitting he becomes AIM's mascot.

Patrick Casey [00:20:16] Yeah Aiden, Aiden is Flying Dutchmann's dog, Flying Dutchmann was doxed recently, doesn't seem too worried about it. That was probably a good sign but yeah. His German shepherd was featured in the dox so yes, I think that Aiden, you can now officially be AIM's, AIM's mascot.

Patrick Casey [00:20:36] Sonic - can you tell us which DC airport would be the closest to the HQ? Looking into flights now.

Patrick Casey [00:20:42] So, either Reagan or Dulles. But if you fly into BWI it would, it's not going to be the, I mean Reagan, Reagan or Dulles. But if you fly to BWI it's not the end of the world.

Patrick Casey [00:20:59] Evolutionary Koala - If we're going to have a Wikipedia force, why not employ them on an entire agenda, to change Wikipedia pages regarding history called untruthful.

Patrick Casey [00:21:08] That is a great idea. But we have to start small and that's ensuring that our operation isn't referred to as neo-Nazi. Neo-nazi is even worse than white nationalists, right. We don't get called neo-Nazis that often; on Wikipedia, we do. So start small, and I hope Evolutionary Koala is part of our Wikipedia team. If not, definitely get with Sam.

[00:21:27] That is Sam in New Jersey, he is are our New Jersey coordinator. If you're not on MatterMost then getting on MatterMost is step one, because that's where we're coordinating that.

[00:22:52] Some of our patrons have not been added to the patrons team, the patron's lounge team on MatterMost. Please get in contact with Argument of Perigee. We want to get you all set up there, we already have quite a few of you but I want to make sure that all of our esteemed patrons have made it. Also, we have this, here's something else here,

yes, so for those of you who wanted to stay at a cabin, in a cabin at Amren that Flying Dutchmann was setting up, let me edit that real quick, then please message him at his Protonmail, that is available in announcements, but I think we're gonna set up a server for that as well. But the server's only gonna be for people who have registered for AmRen, not people were like oh i think i might I want to go so I'm gonna join the server, so if you're serious about going,, if you buy your ticket and you're good to go, you just need lodging, then please please get in touch.

[00:24:16] Ok guys any more questions? I'm not seeing any. If you have them please shoot me a message. One piece of OPSEC advice I want to keep in mind, when you guys to keep in mind is that using the same alias across different platforms is not the best idea. Now within all of our platforms, you need to use the same thing. I don't want to see people using different names. It's been really confusing. You want to change your, your pseudonym from the Wikipedia, sorry, from the recent, the IE dox, on the IE leaks, then, yeah, I think that's probably wise, but, you know don't use your Xbox Live gamer tag as your pseudonym here, don't use a handle used on a forum, you know, a decade ago, on here. You don't want to have the same alias across different things, that people Google your alias or they Google your name on MatterMost nickname you use, some, they shouldn't be able to find stuff from previous chapters of your life.

[00:25:23] Attrition In Exile - What should we say to our friends potential recruits who have been shaken by the recent doxings and media coverage?

[00:25:28] Well, you could tell them that the easy way to not get doxed is by not posting information about yourself on the internet and not, being, you know, not blaming anyone here, obviously, there's, we have to do everything that we can. But I mean look at the guys who didn't get doxed. Look at all the people, the overwhelming majority of people who used our Discord server didn't get doxed.

[00:25:51] We had told people not to post personal information. I don't think we were as explicit as we should have been. We didn't crack down hard enough on it as we should have. And so I'm not blaming anyone, in fact I've blamed, you know, I've been looking at everything that I can do to ensure that this doesn't happen again. But if you're talking to people who were spooked, just say, look, join under an alias, don't offer information about yourself. You know, that's the easiest way to avoid, to avoid that.

[00:26:26] Yeah, just talked about how it's a relatively small fraction of people, you know the, these, the, there are ways to participate in this where you don't get doxed.

[00:27:23] Flying Dutchmann just sent me a message. He's absolutely right: 'Ultimately, however, men can't be afraid to act upon their convictions.'

[00:27:31] Absolutely. Absolutely. We understand that that there are risks that we take. And I would, I would ask people who support what we do, and are comfortable with getting involved, to give us a recurring monthly donation, or to give us a few thousand dollars once a year. These are people who sit on the sidelines and they say oh I'd love to do something but I'm scared. And they don't even just send us cash which is like you know virtually untraceable. Those, those are, I don't have a lot of respect for people like that. Right. You're going to say you supported this cause you better be giving money to VDARE, AmRen, us, I mean even, I don't know, I was gonna say the Proud Boys but I don't know about that. If you, if you support, you know, the identitarian cause then you need to be supporting identitarians somehow. For a lot of people that's that's just going to

be financial. That's fine. But for a lot of people like Flying Dutchmann for example, that's financial, moral, intellectual, showing up, right, so there are a lot of people the organization are doing it all and we couldn't do this without them.

[00:28:37] There was any last questions...

[00:29:05] So, uh, Celtic has just Dm'd me and Celtic is not Celtic Flame. So those of you looking for your long lost friend Celtic Flame, you'll have to keep searching, but you know where you can find her? You'll find her on MatterMost. Celtic Flame has made it to the promised land. So if you're looking to get back in touch then that's how you can do it.

[00:29:33] Guys I would recommend getting your email, or exchanging emails or phone numbers with people you're close to in your chapter, with your chapter leader in particular. So in case anything like this happens again, and again I don't predict that, that we, we're able to coordinate and so forth.

[00:30:01] Well I'm not seeing any questions so we're going to wrap up here. It's only been an hour and we covered quite a bit of ground. Usually the questions take longer anyways but, I'm going to, please, you know, maybe copy paste or write down what you need from the announcements, because I'm going to delete the server in a few minutes. I will give you guys time though, but thank you for all of your support. Thank you for everything. I certainly couldn't do this alone and knowing that I have such a great team in terms of the interviewers, the moderators, people on the Wiki team, activists, members, and so forth. It really gives me confidence that we're going to be able to take this organization, build it up into something that is big, that is powerful, hegemonic, and something that is ultimately able to effect great change for the good of our people.
