[00:00:01] ...Memorial Day weekend, hope it was productive and healthy rather than an excuse to binge eat and drink, as it is for many people. But if it was I won't judge you, I won't judge you. But anyways I've been sick for the past 3 days so I've been working, but not as much as I would have liked to, [audio skips] about 90 percent better which is good.

[00:00:29] But anyways the whitepill of the week, let me pull up my notes here, our whitepill of the week is the results, or are the results, of the EU elections. So national populism is on the rise. And we saw great wins and great gains made in the EU parliament for Italy's The League, for Front Nationale, Brexit party, FIDAS and perhaps a few others that I haven't been able to remember. But populism is on the rise. And despite, despite the fact that despite the fact that we seem to have had a dud in the form of Donald, Donald Trump, who seems to, I mean he wasn't the first populist right winger, Orban, but who's been doing this for longer sure. But Trump is really, or at least he was the, seemed to be the embodiment of the apotheosis of this wave of populism. But for whatever reason, there are many reasons, Donald Trump seemed to be the one we got, which is, which is unfortunate, but I am optimistic in the long run.

[00:01:49] I do think things are absolutely trending towards populism, towards sorting out the issues of globalism, and so now the big reason why you think we're seeing more change in Europe. There are many many reasons that we can get into trouble. Economic perhaps and so forth. Honestly I think a big one is the fact that they have a parliamentary system that parties can come along, and you know, in the span of a few years just totally alter the playing field, right. That's what should happen if you want to have you know supposedly democratic system, but we don't have that, we have the two party system. And you know their parties end up just being ways to peel votes from the main parties or to spread awareness of certain ideas.

[00:02:37] So I support stuff like that here in America but the idea that someone's going to get elected as a third party candidate seems, seems overly ambitious to the point of just being stupid. But it'll be interesting to keep an eye on Europe to see how things go, right. We have the national elections later in the year. I think it definitely looks good for again, maybe France, the UK perhaps. Continues to look good for Hungary.

[00:03:09] Things [inaudible] but since this is the whitepill of the week we won't get into that but you know the Green Party which is pretty terrible did make some gains. That's unfortunate.

[00:03:22] Anyways, along moving along to our round up. So in the past week we had a number of fantastic Memorial Day actions, a lot of you guys went out there and created some tasteful memorials, you know, at memorials, I suppose, by pictures of, of our activists going out paying their respects to remember the fallen, and so forth, good stuff. Thank you to everyone who participated in that.

[00:03:52] Other than that, the big thing from last week was the Kate Smith video. I mean, I forget the date that this was actually done on, but we wanted to wait til after Memorial Day to post it. Yeah. Props to everyone who participated in the Kate Smith action. If you haven't seen it, check our Twitter page, it's the most recent tweet, so it's, it's, it's really phenomenal work, that a few guys, it was only with a handful of people who were

responsible for this one, but it goes to show, some creativity, you know, incorporating a man on the street thing, right. We don't have to just think in terms of traditional activism in the sense that, you know, you go out to a place and you yell into a megaphone and that's it. No. You know, it's all about the content at the end of the day, and this form of content was particularly effective, I really liked getting people's opinions on it right. Showing that people were supportive of Kate Smith. They were not in agreement with these leftists who think that everyone who had, you know, the quote unquote wrong opinion, however at any point in time needs to have any memory of them erased from history, it's just absolutely absurd, right. So props to everyone who participated in that. That was, that was definitely one of the best actions I've seen in a while. It was a really good action. That's going to get posted probably tomorrow or Friday.

[00:05:16] That took place before all of this, but we've just, you know, there are some issues with getting video edited and so forth, so that one will be out in a few days as well, so be on the lookout for that.

[00:05:28] But what's coming up in the future. [00:05:31] So, the weekend of the 4th of July we are going to be doing a number of actions in D.C. and I'm inviting you all to come out for that. So this will be similar to the D.C. action that we did for Politics and Prose. [13.2s] Go ahead, I'm going to have a more in-depth announcement coming on, on MatterMost in a few, in a few days here. But for now, what you can know is that if you send thirty dollars to our electronic payment processor, or you can send it to our P.O. Box, you mark it for Fourth of July action, then that will count as registration, that will cover three meals, and, you know, fourth of July is on a Thursday, so we're going to, I think we'll probably do a few things on Thursday, but I'll invite people out for the rest of the weekend. There's quite a lot that we can do in terms of activism, fraternity, and so forth. So definitely be on the lookout for that. And I would strongly encourage you guys to come out, to get active. You know, there seems to be, well we'll talk about this in a minute here. I'll finish with, with the second action to be aware of, so other than that, [00:06:48] there is the action taking place in August in Texas. [3.3s] For more information you can check the announcement that I made on MatterMost but pretty, we're going to be coming up with ticket prices for that. That's going to be one that you definitely do not want to miss.

[00:07:05] But there's going to be more information coming on that on MatterMost like I just said.

[00:07:11] So there seems to be a sense of demoralization that has, I mean, honestly, it's, it's been a gradual thing since the election, since heilgate, since Charlottesville, since, you know, the basically dissolution of the movement that we were all formerly a part of.

[00:07:34] A lot of demoralization has to do with not only the collapse of the alt-right, but basically the collapse of Trump, at least as far as we can tell. So here's, here's the thing, people who see things going badly and decide to get less active are weak. They're weak people and they're not the people that are going to make a difference. They're not the people that are going to change history. No, it's the people who see things going badly who double down and say I'm, I'm needed now more than ever. Right. Those are the people that are going to make the difference and the question to you is which one of the two are you. Right now I understand that not everyone can participate in all of this in the same way. Some people are going to be comfortable being activists other people are going to prefer to offer financial support. Why we have the patrons program. Others are going to be more active in the community. Some people are going to do a combination of the three so keep that in mind. Keep that in mind. You know if in history people just gave

up once you know morale suffers a little bit then nothing would happen. People would just lose the minute [audio skips] being able to overcome setbacks is a very, very important thing in any undertaking. That's important for us as well. It's probably going to get worse before it gets better. That refers to the broader situation, and, and our dissident movements in particular, it's kind of the microcosm of all of this. But you've got, to you've got to ask yourself, are you in this for the long haul? And if you're not, what's more important, right, what's more important to you than this. There's nothing that's more important to me than the achievement of our aims, right, than the victory that we all aspire for. Right. And if we don't win, things are just going to get worse, and our kids are going to have it far, far worse than we did right. And it's going to be, so I think we all know that. But perhaps it's worth keeping in mind that this is more than just a social club right. People who view membership in the organization as, it's just a fun thing, I don't feel like paying dues anymore, goodbye, well these people are still operating, you know, they still don't have it in their head that things are about to get really bad unless something changes, and we absolutely have the ability to spread our message, to build networks of people [inaudible]

[00:10:01] Those are two of the biggest, two of the most important things that we can do. The media political angle, right. Going out there and calling into question the ruling ideology, right, the source of much of our world, most of our woes I should say. And in just raising awareness, letting people know, look, if you see things the way that we do, if you recognize the same problems that we recognize, then you're not alone. You don't have to be alone.

[00:10:29] You can't talk about this stuff around your bosses, because the system is designed, you know, maybe even, from even friends and family, because the system is designed to stifle dissent. But you can link up with other people who have, like, so fortunately we have been able to build a very, very solid team, and there are people in AIM who have been members of this organization since the founding, who are members of Identity Evropa, who are active in the dissident right before all of that, right. It's, we need that kind of dedication if we're going to succeed. So we do absolutely have to view this as a revolutionary struggle if we just view it, I mean, it should be fun, and it is fun, and the community aspect is absolutely vital to everything. But if we don't get even more serious about this, then nothing is going to change. So we need to keep at it with the activism, we need to keep showing up, guys, showing up is the single most important thing that you can do as a member of this organization, show up to the activism event, show up to the community events, right. If you, if you're going to local meet ups that's just, it's a huge part of everything that we're doing. I mean, if you have an extra \$50 or more per month to offer, then you can become a patron, you can talk to, shoot me a message on MatterMost. I'll give you more information about.

[00:11:55] But this is serious. This is absolutely serious and for better or worse, we have the ability to direct the flow of history. We absolutely do. I mean the alt-right absolutely did. I would argue, the way I see it now, maybe not for the best, for the better, but we'll just have to see how everything plays out. I think we will look back on the alt-right phase, which lasted basically 2015 to early 2018, and look at that and say OK, that, that all, that not everything needed to happen. But, you know, that, that was basically the emergence of suppressed truth, and it was a bit messy. It was a bit disorganized and we saw the results of that. But at the same time it wouldn't really have happened any other way. That's something worth considering. That was the source, I see the alt-right as basically being the birth of all of this. Now afterwards, it was a question of creating order, of creating infrastructure around this nation's movement, business and energy and so...

[00:13:07] So this is somewhat of an aside, but I forgot to say this earlier, if you know of anyone who still needs to be added to the national server then please let me know.

[00:13:16] We have around 600 people who are current on dues, between 500 to 600 are current on dues, which is good for an organization that has only been around for a few months, but on the national MatterMost we only have 200 something. [13.6s]

[00:13:30] So we are continuing to get people onto MatterMost in general, and we are also continuing to add people to the national MatterMost.

[00:13:38] We have, we were seeing applications come in at a very impressive rate. Props to the interviewing team for putting in the time and energy to ensure that only the best and the brightest and the non-infiltrators are allowed into the organization. And so far they've done a very good job.

[00:14:01] But yes, I think there are people who haven't made it over to MatterMost but they're current on dues, if any, if you know of any such people, send me their names, send me their emails, I will look into it. And if you know of anyone whose, whose on MatterMost but not on national like I just said, then let me know and I will get them set up as well.

[00:14:23] Also, dues. So as all of you are likely aware, [00:14:30] every Monday, people who are more than three months or more behind on dues are, they're moved to jail, [5.2s] so they lose the ability to communicate with their regional, the group basically, and with the national team as well. So we don't want that to happen to you. So you can go to members dot American identity movement dot com and, pretty sure that's the URL, and you can log in and see your dues, see when you're paid up, and so I would recommend doing that and having a reminder set on your phone for when they expire, so we don't have to badger you, but we will badger you because that's part of our, part of the job. And, you know, it's important to keep that in mind, we don't want to have to deal with the hassle, you know, you don't want to have to deal with the hassle of getting put in jail. No, the food isn't good. The accommodations aren't great, so it's something I really want you, want you, want to spare you, but that is, so that's dues.

[00:15:32] Let's talk about the Patrons program for a minute. So the Patrons program is coming along nicely, we're starting to implement more benefits for the patrons. I'm working with the patron liaison now. He had some brilliant ideas that we were going to roll out for the next one, that we're going to roll out. Is that so we've, we've been doing monthly patrons calls in which I talk to the patrons about, little, clue them in a little bit more as to what's going on behind the scenes, let them know, you know, some things that are, that are gonna be taking place in the future, answer questions, address comments and concerns and so forth.

[00:16:10] But what we're going to do is we're going to add to this a Q and A session with a prominent figure in the movement, alright, so someone like Jared Taylor, or, I don't know. So there are many other people [inaudible] talking to patrons team to see who is interested or who you guys rather would be interested in having in these.

[00:16:33] But I think this is a good way to offer the patrons a little bit more because they are providing very, very important financial support to the organization.

[00:16:45] So a monthly chat, basically, with, with anyone that I can invite out. If you asked for Donald Trump, I would, I would question why. He asks for Ann Coulter

[inaudible] like this it might be a little harder, but you know, it never hurts to always reach out, but, you know, someone who I could conceivably bring on, is someone that we could have on there. So if you're interested in that you can message Carl from Illinois. He is our patron liason.

[00:17:17] Beyond that we're looking at having some other options available for the higher tiers too. So be on the lookout. We'll, we'll definitely announce those as well, announce them once they're ready.

[00:17:32] So when it comes to announcements, we're going to have a fantastic announcement coming out. Basically should be next week, early next week.

[00:17:47] So this has to do with, well, I'm not going to spoil it for, a few people in here would be very disappointed if I did, but has to do with, you know, other ways that you can contribute to the organization. Maybe a new department. A new program, something along these lines, something that, you know, the most dedicated among us would really appreciate. But beyond that, I will say no more. But it is absolutely around the corner. And I'm, I'm very looking forward to unveiling, it's got a lot of great stuff happening behind the scenes.

[00:18:22] [00:18:22] I recently applied to a, I've been working with a payment processor and it seems to be going well. My experience with trying to get payment processors as a dissident has been they don't respond to your first e-mail or the first phone call you have, they tell you to screw off, sometimes rudely, right, so if you're dealing with these high risk payment processors, it's kind of shady people that are, that are doing it, but basically, basically, that I have filled out a number of applications, I've sent in our founding documents, had a number of phone calls, I've actually met with people in person. So this is going along pretty well, and they're pretty, they, so far so good. So far so good. Also I'm fairly confident, though nothing is 100 percent sure, that we will be able to keep this option, should we get it, shall we say, hidden away from prying eyes, right. [57.0s]

[00:19:21] Because the issue is something like Stripe is it's pretty easy for people to look at the HTML on your website or to, to look at, or to look at their credit card statement and see Stripe, or whatever else. So that's, that's what we're, that's, that's how we're doing there. Again, we will make do in the meantime with our, the, the electronic payment processing platform that we have available now, you can go into Resources on National to see what that is. Also, I'd like to advise you, keep, please keep in mind that anything that's on national should only be for people on national.

[00:20:05] So to get on the national, that's the highest level of security, obviously, again, nothing is 100 percent impervious. No system's a hundred percent impervious to infiltration. But yeah. So just keep that in mind though. So if anyone asks you for the fireside, sorry, for the weekly address link, they would ask you for the payment processor link or anything else, oh, what was, was, what was the latest announcement, you should just tell them to take a look for themselves, or verify that they're actually in the channel, channel, or send it my way.

[00:20:40] Beyond that, so there is an interesting article that includes all of the administrative stuff that I had to tell you guys. Now we're going to talk a little about an interesting article that I read earlier, and some of the implications for us, I've been thinking about these things quite a bit recently, just the future of America in particular. So Ross Douthat, who is the Catholic, fairly, fairly conservative, though I would argue

cucksurvative, author for the New York Times, writer for The New York Times. He posted an article by a guy named Matthew Walter, Walter, Walter in the week, titled 'America Is An Empire Not A Nation'. So this article is worth reading. I don't agree with all of it. It makes some good points. It also makes some really bad points on but I think it gets to a very, very as you know, a very uncomfortable perhaps, and I just posted this in Announcements if you want to take a look, I guess to a, perhaps an uncomfortable subject to address, that is, whether or not America is a nation or an empire. So it's been an NRX talking point for quite some time that America is an empire, one that pretends not to be one. And in fact some of the neo-reactionaries in their, in their prescriptions for what they would like to do, is to a fully establish America as an, as an empire, acknowledge that it is such, such, and govern it accordingly. So the argument essentially that's, that's made here, is that nation is, rather a nation state is a state defined by some degree of commonality in terms of language, ethnicity, race and religion. I don't see too much commonality there. Right. Because we have English for the time being, but even then there's a push to not encourage people to learn English. That's considered racist. I mean we really are at the point where assimilation, expecting people to assimilate is racist. So, so that is, that is clearly a departure from the nation-state right. That is moving towards a plural, multicultural or a pluralistic empire. Now there are a number of ways you could look at empires but there are two main, there's, there's a big distinction that you could draw, the distinction between multicultural empires and pluralistic empires, I'm sorry. No. Multicultural empire, which, which could be considered pluralistic, that's more or less the same thing, and a homogenized, homogenizing, I guess we could say empire. So the difference between the two is that a multicultural or a pluralistic empire is one in which the ruling class preserves difference. They basically have, I think it was what Allen David Marr refers to as the right to difference. Right. There isn't a top down push to homogenize, basically, well, groups are different, and they have their right to be themselves, practice their own customs, have their own values, maybe even have their own, I don't know, communities and stuff like that. So that is not really what we have now. It's, it's almost like we actually do have that, but for, not for white people, for every other group, every other group is allowed to remain as different as they [audio skips]... But but there is also, there are homogenizing empires as well, and those are ones in which they seek to, as the name would suggest, homogenize their populations, right. Take all of these disparate groups and meld them into one. So I think that both dynamics are kind of in play, but the thing to keep in mind here is that, you know, it's almost as if there's a push for you to homogenize people in America, right the American, you can't even say the American people, people in America, basically there's a push to homogenize people in America.

[00:24:55] But it's, there is also a preservation of difference when it benefits the left, right, they're, they're not, you know, they're pushing white people to accept multiculturalism, diversity. It's basically the state religion right. The ruling ideology of progressivism, tolerance, diversity, multiculturalism, LGBT, right, we all have all of these various things that form, basically, the state religion, and you're, everyone is supposed to accept this, but white people have to as well. I mean it's almost like a weird form of Catholicism, where you have to accept that, but you can accept your native beliefs too right. You know, you can be a Muslim, right, you can keep your Muslim trappings, but you have to, you know, your cultural practices and whatever, but you have to follow the ideology. And that's, that's a big part of what Catholicism did, and that isn't a judgment, a value judgment there, it's, you know, the word Catholic I believe means universal, and, you know, that's why you have they're, they're spreading, they'd spread the doctrine of Catholicism around the world, but they would allow, you know, Catholic practice would look a little different in, you know, when practiced by an African than it would by a German, right. I mean that's because Catholicism can, you know, basically, i'm looking for the right word, but, so, I always get

distracted when I get messages. You know, Catholicism could basically incorporate the native traditions and so forth, so that's kind of what we have here. We have the state, the ruling ideology of progressivism and it will tolerate difference so long as the main dogma is adhered [00:26:46]to. But the point that I'm getting at, the reason why this matters, is that there's a very good chance that we're never going to be able to go back to America as a nation state. I mean, that's kind of what Trump represented, right. The last hurrah of white America, of America America, of America as we've come to know it. So the nation state route would entail acknowledging and affirming America's historical demographics and identity. [31.1s] In order to do that, we would have to reverse demographic trends. And that's been a big part of what we've focused on as identitarians, and what the the dissident right has. But we also have to keep in mind there's, there's a potential that, you know, we're eventually gonna hit the point of no return. We're obviously going to become minorities. So with that in mind it's, it's, we, we do have to be thinking about different solutions. Now even if we decide that immigration isn't going to be the biggest issue to hit on, it's still absolutely worth talking about the negative effect of immigration on all of this. We want to adequately address, diagnose and fix American decline. And you can't talk, you can't do that without talking about identity, immigration and demographics. Sure. But let's say we accept eventually that America, that these demographics, it's, it's too late. Well at that point, America would kind of accept that America is going to be a multi-ethnic empire. And I think it will. I think it will be for the foreseeable future. Maybe that could change at some point. But the challenge then at that point becomes ensuring that our people are able to survive and prosper. Now just the presence of brown people is not enough to basically, you know, ensure that we're all gonna be impoverished and getting stabbed to death by heroin dealers walking down the street or something, but there are policies then that we would advocate for that would take precedence over immigration in terms of making the lives of our people better. So if we're going to have a pluralistic empire, then we do have to assert the right to difference, right, no pluralism.

[00:29:03] [00:29:03]We as white Americans have a right to our own communities, [2.6s] to not have our identities come under attack, to not be unpersoned for having a healthy sense of identity, being, doing what all of the other groups do.

[00:29:16] [00:29:16]Now obviously the ultimate goal is power. [1.2s] And we I think we understand this as identitarians, and as members of the dissident right, that to just sit back in a multicultural society and allow other groups to take control and think that they're gonna be nice to you, is, it's kind of a dangerous, it's a bit naive shall we say. So within that, there are many examples that we can look at of multicultural empires, or even just states, wherein a minority wields disproportionate amounts of power. [00:29:50]Now, for the foreseeable future, white people are going to be the largest minority group, the largest demographic group. We are also going to be disproportionately wealthy and so forth. We're going to have, still have a huge chunk of the wealth, so going to have a large degree of representation in politics, in other places. Now that could be, all of this could obviously change. What's important to keep that in mind that with proper governance a multi-ethnic empire, pluralistic multicultural empire of America could be a hell of a lot better than it is now. And again, if these demographic changes aren't, if something, basically, unless we have a serious right wing government change things in a dramatic fashion in the next 5 to 10 years, then maybe, maybe give you a little more than that, maybe 5 to 20, I don't know, then at that point, yes, then it will become OK, how do we exist within the empire? [53.8s] And that's a big, I mean, we're basically at the turning point. Right. One of our guys on Twitter, like Eric Thorn shout out, likened, you know, where we are, to Rome, which is is a fairly common thing, but within the context of the transition between Republic to Empire, you know, to a lot of, from what I've gathered, and I'm no historian, to the

average person who lived from, who was alive from the transition from Republic to Empire, they probably saw some pretty climactic stuff happening. They certainly did. Happening in government, in terms of leadership, in all sorts of other things. But, you know, to them it was Rome, Rome, Rome was Rome, and Rome lived. So that might be what, what happens to us, right, we kind of are heading down the empire route. [00:31:33] You know, maybe someone needs to come along strongly, and needs to come along and say, OK, this is an empire, but here's how we're gonna do it. You know, if you, if it's one of our people governing over this empire, then you know we can ensure that our people are not taken advantage of, that we're able to have our communities right, and America's a big country, and, you know, just say, you know, just policies, you know, diverse, as I was pointing out on Twitter, diversity is, there are absolutely issues with diversity, there's a lot of historical, sociological evidence that points that out. But it's important to keep that in mind, that a lot of these studies on diversity, how they're dependent on the groups involved. Some groups can get along better than other groups that probably I don't think anyone would really doubt that. But also the political and the cultural climate has a lot to do with that too, with affirmative action, we're basically incentivizing anti-whiteness, prior to affirmative action, instead of people playing the victim card and trying to show how non-white they are right, trying, you know, for Rachel Dolezal and Elizabeth Warren and so forth, you had, the opposite was the case, you have minorities trying to prove how white they are. There was actually some Latino advocacy group, I forget the name, Saylor mentioned them in an article a week or two ago, that one of their, like one of the first things they did was try to lobby the government to consider latinos white. So that, that's a far different environment than the one we're used to, where people, you know, obviously I think people should be themselves, I don't think non-white people should be pretending to be white. [98.2s] But, you know, I'd rather have, you know, the minorities in the country love us, and try to be us, than hate us and try to like, you know, disenfranchise us. Right. So we should be thinking about solutions. I think that's a big part of what the dissident right should be doing in terms of intellectual wisdom, diagnosing the problem, coming up with solutions, and also figuring out how we get from point A to Point B, right. Talking about what we would do if we gained power, that's, well, I mean it's good to have a plan. You know, what you're gonna do once, you know, you get into power, otherwise you're going to get there and be lik, alright what do I do now. But you know, it's pretty easy to say, well, I'm going to create a monarchy, and I'm going to implement this policy. I mean it's, it's easy to do that, right. It would be harder to actually implement these policies and make sure they work. But you know, before you're actually in that position, it's pretty easy just to, you know, to theorize and so forth. So we are concerned with addressing American decline. We are concerned with coming, coming up with solutions for this. [00:34:13] We're also concerned with finding out ways to achieve these solutions to get from point A to Point B. And now if that is forming some kind of ethnostate, or you know, you know some kind of Balkanization, that could be, you know, that could be an option. Sure. If it's taking control of America and reversing demographic trends humanely and legally. Sure. But the clock's, the clock is definitely ticking there, or if it's, you know, ensuring that our people, or just enlightened rulers in general, take control of the American empire and ensure that our people absolutely have a place here, and ensure that our people occupy the majority of positions of power, right, then so be it. That might be what ends up having to happen. [44.0s] But I'll conclude on this note. There's a lot of talk about Balkanization that obviously refers to, you know, in particular the breakup of Yugoslavia. I don't think we're going to see anything that dramatic. Right. You had multiple ethnic groups who were at each other's throats in a relatively small country. You don't have that, America is big. People can still, you know, you don't, you don't have the same level of ethnic conflict and ethnic hatred here as you did over there. I mean just look at, look at yourself. Look at us, right. You go out in public. Chances are you're around a lot of non-white people and everyone's more or

less getting along. Now, if you live in the hood or something, it might be a little different. But don't live in the hood. For the foreseeable future, the answer to 13 to 50 is to stay the hell away. Stay away. Avoid, avoid them. That's, that's, that's the foreseeable future for that, or rather the, the answer for the foreseeable future there. That basically concludes what I had to say on the subject. Whether or not America will be able to be turned back into a nation state, or whether, or its future as an empire, all of this is up in the air, but we need to, again, build up the best organization, do the best activism to become the best men and women that we can, lay down roots, get married, have kids, build community. That's what we need to do. We are going to be better positioned to take advantage of whatever may come, so long as our infrastructure is, is given attention to, and really developed.
