American Identity Movement (Identity Evropa) Weekly Address by president Patrick Casey June 13, 2019

[00:00:00] All right good evening everyone. Hope you're doing well. Welcome to our weekly address. I'm glad that you can make it, make it out tonight to this part of cyberspace. To begin, why don't you guys why doesn't someone, why doesn't someone let me know how my audio sounds. I have a fan in the background and I want to ensure that you aren't all tortured by the sound of the spinning blades that are keeping me from being too hot here.

[00:00:33] No one has messaged me yet so I'm going to wait. I also want to make sure that you guys can hear me period because that seems to be an issue at times. Sounds good. All right. We are good to go. Thank you to the gentleman who messaged me. Anyways. It has been a an eventful week somewhat, kind of, not really, but I do have a number of things to talk about regardless of how eventful of a week it was.

[00:01:02] We will begin with our white pill of the week as usual and I want to give a shout out to Consiglierge who was kind enough to send me, as he normally does, a white pill of the week. So this one is, the title of this article I was sent was Florida Governor Ron DeSantis expected to sign a measure banning sanctuary cities on Friday. So DeSantis has been pretty good on the immigration front. He's been somewhat of the real deal as far as populism goes. However unfortunately populism is, seems to be in bed with Zionist interests shall we say.

[00:01:44] While he is implementing policies that are from an immigration restrictionist standpoint sound and certainly warranted, you know, he's, I mean he has also enacted anti-BDS legislation, which as anyone familiar with that whole thing knows is a pretty blatant and flagrant violation of our constitutional rights, right, our First Amendment right in particular. So, but, you know at this point we take what we can get and any step toward immigration restrictionism is is certainly warranted and welcome.

[00:02:23] Now for our activism roundup. I'll go ahead and open up our Twitter account. I don't think we had too much happening this past week. We've got quite a bit in the works that we will be discussing in a few minutes here. So we had some flyering, some stickering. Great job as usual. I would definitely encourage you all to not only read the entirety of the AIM member handbook but in particular to read the, to read the materials protocol. Right. So that contains the basics for what to do and what not to do when it comes to distributing our stickers and flyers.

[00:03:07] So yeah that basically concludes all round it's flyering and we had some meetups and so forth happening behind the scenes, which has been, you know, obviously that is a very integral part of our organization, though it certainly isn't everything.

[00:03:21] Moving along. Let's talk about what's upcoming for American Identity Movement. Talk about the upcoming events. The two main events this summer are the Fourth of July action and the action that's taking place in Texas in August. I will repost more information about this on Columbia so that you guys can have something to look at but basically we are going to be having people coming out to the D.C. area to stay at the AIM HQ (or nearby) for a weekend of activism, fellowship and so forth. So activism will not be required. I strongly encourage you all to come out regardless of whether or not you are comfortable showing your face and so forth. But yeah so that's gonna be great. [00:04:14] The best way to register at this point is to send something in to the P.O. box. I am working on getting us a digital, a replacement for Venmo that kicked us off fairly recently. I did set up a Circle Pay a while ago so that we had a backup but it appears at Circle Circle pay is going to be closing up shop in a month. So that leaves us without a payment processer but there many of them out there and we will, we will carry on and find, find a way to make it through this.

[00:04:48] So in the meantime I strongly encourage you guys to mail in your registration for the July 4th action activism weekend. People are going to be invited out as early as Wednesday because we are going to be doing things on Thursday which is the 4th of July. I think the biggest action in the main day will be that Saturday. But so in order to, basically, you know, in order to, I'm sure that everyone can register on time and make it out here and so forth because we're not going to be able to add anyone to the team that we have set up until, until we, you know, until we receive your registration money, then just please be sure to send that in.

[00:05:35] But with, before the end of the week we do, we're pretty confident that we will be able to have a payment processor. Not like a real payment processor, something like Venmo or PayPal that we can use, you know, behind the scenes, while we work on a more long term solution, which we have been working on, but we've been facing setbacks. It all comes back to the money at the end of the day. I'm reminded of how I kind of got started in politics and looking into globalism and so forth was you know the kind of conspiratorial libertarian-esque, you know, talk about the money system and the Fed and banking and all that. And you know we've just basically come back full full circle to that. Anyone who's expressing views at odds with the agenda of our ruling class will, first the money is really how they, how they get us, right, through loss of employment and through denial of service for, you know, from credit card companies, payment processors even banks sometimes. So these are certainly very unfortunate but nevertheless real aspects of this endeavor of ours.

[00:06:47] So the Fourth of July activism weekend is going to be great. I strongly encourage you all to show up. As with all other actions and events, don't show up, don't assume that people are going to show up, assume that if you don't personally show up there won't be enough people out there.

[00:07:00] So next up we have the action that's taking place in August, mid-August, in Texas. You can, I will repost the announcementm, but it's probably still available on there. And that one is going to be great. I need to touch base to see what the ticket price is going to be. So the ticket price for the July action depends on which day you're coming by. And most of that is going towards food. If the organization makes a little off any of these events that we can put in the bank, great. In the past it's generally we don't. If we do it's you know, 100 bucks or a few hundred, not much at all. So this isn't, you know, you are, this is largely to cover the costs of feeding a bunch of people. And anyway, I would strongly encourage you guys to show up to at least one of these. Everyone in here should be able to show up to at least one of these, and again, there is not an activism requirement. It will absolutely be encouraged. There will be actions like maybe park cleanups and stuff like that. That you can participate in safely without having your face shown. And additionally there's quite a bit that can be done behind the scenes in terms of the logistics, the planning, you know, picking up supplies, all sorts of stuff to help support the activists who are going to be putting themselves out there. So I will obviously be at both, I'm working intimately with the organizers for both actions, and both are coming along very well and I'm very excited. Also the, there are going to be speakers at both, definitely some bigger names that you would recognize. So again, both of these actions are these, really events are going to be fantastic and I hope to see you out there.

[00:08:42] I'd like to remind you all that we do have a formal activism proposal process. Do not assume that you can just, I mean you can't just go and do activism and assume that we will post it. Once you have an idea you need to fill out an activism form, and it's not just your chapter leader it's the chapter leader in whichever state - you are hoping to do an action in Montana, the Colorado chapter leader cannot submit that proposal. And that is because we need to ensure that every chapter leader is [inaudible]

[00:09:15] So I've had a number of you come to me for activism [inaudible], you know, with the other organization, Identity Evropa [audio skips] actions, many unique actions as well. But, you know, making a banner, holding it up somewhere, just kind of dropped, or you know maybe you want to do that every six months as you're with your chapter. Sure. It's definitely better than nothing, it won't necessarily get as much traction as something else, right, is to make, you can make cool videos of these banner drops, it definitely makes them [inaudible]... climbing up something, making it, you know, just a minute clip can be, It's, it's good, definitely good content to put out, but I would strongly encourage you, for everyone in here, to diversify the activism that we are doing as an organization. And one of the best ways to do that is to look at what others are doing, follow left wing activists, follow the G.I. Telegram channel to kind of keep tabs on what identitarians are doing around the world. They have kind of a head start on us, so they have a lot of experience that we don't. We are not interested in mimicking, mimicking them but we are interested in learning from them and in kind of adopting things that work, right, doesn't just have to be from G.I. though they are a very good example. Also there's a fantastic book Beautiful Trouble. We have a literature team on MatterMost and I believe they are going through the book Beautiful Trouble so reach out to Peter on Columbia, MatterMost, if you're interested in getting, you know, getting added to the server and/or, you know, joining in on the book club within that site, not server, that team.

[00:10:59] A good way to think about activism is content creation. It doesn't just have to be what, you know, traditional activism in the sense of OK we're gonna drop the banner here, OK we're going to go out and do a demonstration, right. Kate Smith actually was a fantastic example of activism, right. And that was something that wasn't very [inaudible] men on the street, but it was, it was a form of activism, absolutely, and it was very well received and very well designed and implacable, and Trump, you know, just random YouTube content creators, and seeing that kind of stuff [inaudible] and many many great examples of things to do so I would strongly encourage you guys to use that.

[00:11:38] If you come to me looking for ideas, I'll probably tell you all of this. If you have something, you know, you want to do activism around a certain theme then maybe I could be useful. But if you just say Hey what are some good ideas, I'm going to tell you to read Beautiful Trouble, I'm going to tell you to follow G.I., I'm going to tell you, you know, maybe spend a night just watching all of their old videos, looking through the Telegram channel just to find inspiration for that. So. Please bear all of these things in mind.

[00:12:03] And I'd like to remind you all that dues are, every, every Monday, I forget what time, it's Monday morning at 12 noon EST., everyone who is more than, I think it's between two to three months behind on dues, is just automatically jailed. Now getting unjailed is easy so long as you pay your dues, but you don't want to get to that point right. You don't want to get put in jail. You know, the accommodations aren't terribly, they're not

that bad, I mean you'll have, you'll have, you'll have the basics. But as far as, you know, you just don't want to be in jail. The food's not that great. Some of the people in there may be a little rough around the edges so to speak. You're going to have to explain to your friends and family that you got put in jail right. You got locked up. Technically an ex convict at that point once you get let out so that's the spirit of you not being an ex convict. Let's have everyone stay up to date on the dues. You can go to members dot American Identity Movement dot com, register or sign in and see your dues that way. Yeah you should be receiving emails if, if you are behind. If you're not behind on dues and you are receiving these e-mails, then please let me know and we can sort that out.

[00:13:23] But yes. So the best way to do that now I would just say pay for six months through P.O. box at this point, mail a check for fifty five bucks, cash for fifty five bucks. That's also the best way in terms of OPSEC. Right. You don't have to include a return label. You can send cash and just to slip obviously you know please include a slip of the note that specifies what your, your name is on here what information you were under the roster as, just so we know who it is. Because if someone sends 55 dollars and there's no any, there's no nothing to discrenibly indicating that it is, it is from a member for dues. Then we're just gonna assume it's a general donation and treat it as such.

[00:14:10] So let us go through the guidelines. These guidelines constitute our expectations of you as a member of the organization.

[00:14:23] And they can be found in the Resources channel on ours, on our National MatterMost team.

[00:14:30] Now all of you will be required to have read the member handbook by the end of this month, if you haven't done it, do it. It's 15 pages but it's not, it's not, it's not Nietzsche, it's not Heidegger, it's fairly, fairly readable, we should say, so definitely don't put it off, I mean, you are, even though that requirement is the end of the month. You are absolutely going to be held to that standard, to, sorry, all of the standards outlined therein in the meantime. So, you know, saying, oh I didn'y know, isn't an excuse. If you're listening to this you are going to be held to these standards.

[00:15:13] So again, that is in Resources on the national channel. I will open this up now. I will not read the whole guide. I'm still working on, you know, we had a few typos, there weren't really that many. Some people were a little apoplectic after reading it. But some of the formatting error or errors are a little weird because they weren't there when, they're not there in the google doc, they're there, they basically came about as a result of creating the PDF. So I'm not entirely sure how we're going to get around that. But in the meantime you will have to persevere through the spaces that present there.

[00:15:53] But anyways so as a member of American Identity Movement, 1. You will read the AIM member handbook and adhere to all rules and requirements outlined there. So this is the handbook you have to read all of it and adhere to all of it. 2 you will read understand and follow the server rules. The server rules can be found on the national team and are pretty straightforward. Don't, the main ones don't joke about violence. Don't post anything related to the Third Reich. Do not. No racial slurs. I would just go easy on the vulgar language. Keep in mind that you're in mixed company. You know, you have people's wives and mothers in here. So don't you know, again, guys, locker room talk. Not the kind of thing that you want to do on our our servers. [00:16:40] And again, there are also many things that ladies should not be talking about around men. So I think we all kind of, you know, guess as to those, I will not be providing any examples but please bear that in mind. 3 You will not engage in any gestures, use any language or display any paraphernalia relating to the Third Reich. So we're at the point now where everyone gets that we're American nationalists and identitarians. We've moved beyond the 4chan and alt-right culture where people were, spent too much time on the Internet and got memed into believing that, you know, any, any stuff like this was a good idea. So I don't think anyone in the organization now needs to be told what we're about but it's good to have it in writing.

[00:17:25] 4. You will consume alcohol responsibly particularly at AIM events and will not partake in any illegal drug use. Very straightforward stuff. Don't drink like an idiot don't drink and drive. Don't use illegal drugs. If you have if if medical if marijuana either, if the medical or recreational variety is available in your area, then here's what you should do. You should just not talk about it. You know, maybe if it was, I just don't think it's really in line with our culture. If you have like a real need for it, or if you're someone who can still function and whatever, and it's not actually holding you back, I think it does hold most people use it back, then, just, again. Don't talk about it.

[00:18:07] 5. Because ours is a coed organization. You will interact with a members of the opposite sex in a respectable manner. So this is very straightforward stuff.

[00:18:16] Don't be an idiot. Don't be an idiot.

[00:18:20] You know, if you're, we want to facilitate the formation of healthy relationships that eventually lead to marriage and kids. We should all be thinking about that. If you have no romantic prospects, if you're not going on dates, you're not actively trying to find a future mate, husband or wife, then you're doing it wrong. Because many people I think procrastinate this and then they wake up one day and it's too late. So in the spirit of us getting married and having kids, not everyone is going to be able to do that for various reasons and that's OK. But everyone should be pursuing these kinds of things rather than sleeping around. Now, what you do in your free,, in your your personal life, I'm not going to pry too deeply into that. You know, I would only care insofar as it becomes an issue for the organization if you have, if you are somewhat promiscuous in your personal life and you are Blabbing about it to people within our organization that aspires for healthy values then you're clearly not getting it. But just bear in mind that you know, if you, if someone rejects you or something in the organization, just let it go. I've seen, you know, sour grapes kind of coming down as a result of that and that is not conducive to maintaining harmonious communities at the local level in the organization.

[00:19:42] 6. When representing AIM you will dress appropriately and will under no circumstances wear, masks military uniform or other bizarre attire. Straightforward. So we are well adjusted, well-intentioned Americans of European descent. We merely want a future for our people. We want a future for this country that does not involve us being hated minorities. We're not a paramilitary, we are not trying to give anyone that impression. So that's why we don't dress like that or act like that.

[00:20:11] 7. You accept that religious differences exist within the organization and you will behave respect fully toward members of other faiths than your own. So you as a member of AIM will interact with pagans, Protestants, Catholics, Mormons, people interested in, I don't know the philosophy of Julius Evola. You know. So you just have to be tolerant of other people. Some degree of pluralism is going to have to be tolerated. And

you know we do have freedom of religion in this country even though it does have a Protestant history. So everyone should do well to keep that in mind. No, no one is going to respect you for trying to overly proselytize or evangelize or down talk other people because of their religions. And I think this is more an issue of personality type. That's why you don't it see too often because our pare eople high quality people, people who are agreeable tend to self select. I mean we obviously have our selective procedures to ensure that only the best get in, so.

[00:21:17] 8. You respect the authority of your chapter leader and will work with him rather than against or around him when it comes to planning activism and community events. No need to elaborate too much on that.

[00:21:28] 9. You will safeguard not only your own personal identity but that of other AIM members as well. So. You have a duty to yourself and to your fellow members to guard your OPSEC and others.

[00:21:44] I won't spend too much time talking about OPSEC tonight but I would definitely urge you all to read the OPSEC guide that is contained within the member handbook.

[00:21:57] 10. You will not engage in violence, particularly during activism. So if we engage in violence we are playing into the hands of the left, the media and the political establishment. The state is absolutely thrilled when people of our ideological inclination get violent because that gives them the pretext to, to do what they want to do to us and that is to shut us down. So there are many reasons not to be violent. Strategic and ethical. And we just need to bear that in mind. Extreme self-defense situations absolutely warrant, you know, doing what is necessary to, to defend yourself. Right, if someone is threatened, it is, you know, has you on the ground and then repeatedly punching you in the face, do what you have to do to save you, get out of there. Right. But if some, this means that if someone comes up and shoves you, you don't just punch them in the face, right. Even if someone comes up and throws a punch at you, right, try blocking, getting your hand up, telling them to take a step back, telling them to take it easy. But, you know, we just can't be seen as the aggressors, and we can't be the aggressors. For legal and PR reasons, basically the last thing you want is to have to defend yourself within the context of a violent altercation while you were doing identitarian activism. Because especially if the other person who attacks you is non-white, transgender, gay, they, they will absolutely pursue some kind of hate crime. Well there's a good chance they could. So we don't want that to happen.

[00:23:31] 11. You will refrain from carrying weapons, particularly guns and knives, during AIM activism. So you don't need a weapon to do AIM activism. If you're one of these guys who doesn't wanna leave the house without conceal carrying, that's ok, just don't do AIM activism.

[00:23:47] 12. You will only engage in legal activism. So everything we do has to be legal since we are constantly under scrutiny. We have to be constantly above reproach. So that's why you need to read the materials protocol and adhere to all the guidelines therein, to avoid incurring incurring vandalism charges and, you know, or simply putting up flyers that, you know, doing a flyering event that we can't use on social media.

[00:24:14] 13. You will constantly strive for self-improvement. You need to be striving to be the best and most effective agent of change as possible. And if we see you let yourself go, you kind of devolve into drinking, obesity, many other ways that people can destroy

themselves, and we will absolutely talk to you and possibly let you go if nothing changes there.

[00:24:55] 14. You understand that membership in AIM is exclusive with that of other similar organizations. You will therefore only participated in AIM activism. So this means you can't join any other dissident right organization unless you have explicit approval. If you tried to be sneaky and participate in other dissident right activism we'll probably find out and we'll have to let you go. So if you want to be involved in any other group just come to me and I will be more than happy to tell you whether or not that is permissible within our organization. But obviously stuff like, you know, you want to get involved in TPUSA, or your Collge Republicans. Sure that's fine.

[00:25:38] 15 you represent aAIM in a positive manner. So advocacy of, or participation in any form of supremacy, violence, illegal activity, or otherwise unethical behavior is explicitly prohibited. Just keep in mind that as while you are a member of AIM everything you do within the context of AIM or not even in any political context has the, will reflect on us. It has the capacity to get back to us so keep that in mind. Keep that in mind.

[00:26:08] So that concludes the guidelines. I would like you to, again, all of you have to read this document, the AIM member handbook, from start to finish and I reserve the right to maybe quiz some of you guys at some point if needed.

[00:26:23] Because it is very, it is very important for us to be maintaining standards. A big issue with the alt-right is that there weren't really standards and that was largely a result of, argely a result of their being, the alt-right lacked. it was very decentralized, it lacked a central hierarchy. I don't think that really justifies or excuses the lack of standards that we saw in the alt-right. However the fact that we do have a hierarchy means that we absolutely have the ability to exercise quality control and, you know, a few bad apples have the ability to spoil the ability to, you know, the ability for us to build a kind of movement that is going to be able to succeed in its goals.

[00:27:25] The ultimate goal for our organization is to, to effect change that will lead to a shift in power. We need, in order for there to be any lasting change in this country the globalists need to be removed from power. Legally and nonviolently. And that is not just a political thing. The deep state needs to be dismantled, or there needs to be the construction of an identitarian deep state. Easier said than done. That's the kind of thing that generally comes after you have power, though perhaps there are arguments to be made for the contrary, the media, financial system, right. All all of these centers of power need to be, as long as globalism is promoted therefrom, then there's not you know, build a wall, you can change immigration laws, in 50 years and won't matter or in ten years it won't matter.

[00:28:19] And we're seeing that now we're seeing the results of the cathedral, as it were, preventing our democratically elected president from effecting, implementing the types of policies that he ran on. So lastly, I want to talk about the Ashley St. Clair situation. If you've been following my tweet on, my, sorry, my feed on Twitter, then you've, you've probably become aware of this. But I think it's kind of an amusing tale and it is, it illustrates that there are many lessons to be taken there in how power is exercised.

[00:28:58] Now we as a dissident vanguard can influence the broader right. For the better. So Ashley St. Clair is a conservathot, for lack of a better term, and I am not, I will not apply that term to any girl who's promoting conservatism and right wing things but she totally fits

the bill. So she, you know, she's, she has some relationship with TPUSA. I think she was a chapter of her young Americans for Liberty. You know at her local university. She's like 20 years old. And she goes to school. But. She did a few things to get on my radar. The first was Ashton Witty actually had a good tweet for once and she tweeted out a picture of an Irish classroom 50 years ago and that same like Irish classroom today. And obviously it's like all African was not African before. Yes, the Irish are white in case there was any doubt. But they are, so, she said, you know, Ashton Witty was taking issue with the great replacement, and that, it's fantastic. Plenty that could be said about Ashton Witty otherwise. But you know when she has a good tweet that should be encouraged, right, people in the main, you know, the broader right, should be encouraged when they do, when they do goood they should be encouraged. I mean if we find a way to incentivize them to seek our approval, which is certainly a dynamic that has existed in the past, then that is a good way to steer things in the right direction. Now Ashley StClair guote tweeted that and said I feel like this is kind of low key racist. So why does it matter like what skin color they are. So it's like OK you are, you're not a NeverTrumper, or you're supposedly Trumpian, you have some relationship with TPUSA, and you are just totally blue pilled on demographics. So that kind of, she deleted the tweet once she started getting some heat. Well later, Nick Fuentes had some words for her. I think he called her like a dumb bimbo and she responded like, oh, you know, tell me how I am the dumb bimb. He said alright, you know, come on my show, let's debate. She initially agreed and then she disagreed. She like backed out of the debate I think because of her like alt-lite handlers and that's the thing, these people don't want to debate us. But. Pardon me. So what happened after that is. You know, these the nickers, the Nick Fuentes kind of viewers, discovered that this girl who is again 20, used to be on Twitter, well she has, sh=e has a Twitter account name of @optatives (sp?) and there were some interesting and a bit, shall we say sordid or salacious, tweets on there, but that was, she made that account, so she has the current account, then before that it was optatives and then before that, it was @sexlaptop. So this girl's 14, 15 years old and she was just being a, totally like sensuous on social media. Now I'm not a total Puritan but you know obviously this is like my issues here are more strategic than moral. But at the same time this is pretty unacceptable behavior anyways. But given that she's not really in our camp I wouldn't be as much of an issue. It's more a pretext to, you know, hold her feet to the fire and basically to punish her for just having awful opinions and claiming to represent the best interests of this country while at the same time clearly not understanding anything or actually getting it and just being you know hostile to what really matters. So as @sexlaptop she was posting nudes, she, you know, selling nudes, and again, she was underaged. So hopefully no one, none of those surfaced. You know, she had, just you can find a lot of these old tweets just through various methods. And she I mean she was just saving like, obscene, things so obscene I just will not repeat them or like or retweet any of that stuff. But you know if you look at any of the stuff that these nickers are posting, you will absolutely know, you'll see what she was too. So basically people started dragging that up. And I did a thread about her, you know, not, you know, denying the great replacement being an issue, which again is a huge red flag, and something that people deserve to be called out for. And I also just had one of the tweets in that thread, I did, they said oh and you know @zoomerclips and then this other guy, you know, unearthed some very questionable content,, you know tweets from the past and so forth. And, then I quote tweeted the optatives account and I said wow, youu know, it was one where she was using the N-word. It's like wow she was calling out Kyle Kashuv for using the N-word. But here she is using it.

[00:34:18] So next day she DM's me, and we had never spoken before, we never interacted before. I probably had no idea. Well I don't know, maybe she knows who I am.

But she said that account isn't me, LOL. And then she, I said which one, and then she linked to optatives and she said I've never spoken like that in my life.

[00:34:39] And I was like Oh OK. So just be clear. She said No I was hacked. I was like OK. So just be clear that, that account was you, but you were hacked for that tweet and obviously I was hoping to get her to say yes and then drag up like some older tweets and just say OK what about these. But she never responded past that. I have no idea why she messaged me honestly. She was probably really scared and just like Oh crap. Good. These, you know, again, we're not just trying to torment innocent people, we are trying to enforce standards and create a social cost for those of us who are not those of us for those in the right who are clearly grifters and opportunists and seek to profit from peddling bad narratives while our country burns. So well it didn't, you know, people were talking about that, but it didn't, you know, conservatives are, they're willing to overlook some teenage girl being a bit vulgar, sexually vulgar, when she, you know, five, six years ago, but what ended up happening was she, what ended up happening was, someone else, this guy David Santa Carla something, on Twitter, that guy deserves a follow, but he went back in, and, you know, God bless him, listened to a bunch of these, listened to a bunch of, you know, watched a bunch of her old streams and he found one where she's just basically saving like, yeah, I don't get why people care about immigration, like illegal immigration is like, not that big of a deal or whatever. [Inaudible] it's like wrong from every perspective. So he tweets that, this guy's got like, you know, two and half thousand followers. Mark Dice quote tweets that, says you know, this girl should just stick to makeup and Ann Coulter quote tweets it and says Aha. So we manage to get people from from the dissident right, the seemingly small part of Twitter, to get these huge accounts to amplify the message and say, you know, we're basically just pointing out, like, hey even by like altlight standards this girl is just totally garbage. And so that has been really good and then today this guy, David Santa Carla, I believe, found footage of her talking about how TPUSA is actually like lame. She was like, oh she referred to it as like, oh, a bunch of, bunch of lame white dudes or, you know what, it's just a bunch of white dudes in MAGA hats, like, you know, and just something like that, [00:37:19]so she's, she's Jewish for the record so I don't know if she has some kind of ethnic animus simmering beneath the surface my hunch would be that that is the case. She was also tweeting about an affinity for dark skinned men under her sex laptop account so who knows what's going on there. [21.1s] Sorry Ben Shapiro, that's not a loss for us. But yeah so, so what's, you know, do should we care about the drama, you know, to some extent. But the reason I'm talking about this is because we effectively made there be a price for having the wrong opinion. We held this girl's feet to the fire. And I've heard from behind the scenes that her circle is kind of alt-lite handlers are extremely panicked and it might actually get back on them and they might get, you know, screwed over, you know, all these people that promoted her, and she's like, she's not even saying that illegal immigration is an issue, like, it's, it's because a lot of people in the alt-light are like staunch on illegal immigration. Legal immigration maybe not as much, but like, you know, you have this go out there that promoted just saying like that's the dumbest, most indefensible stuff from a Trump, a Trumpian perspective. And it's great. So we should do this more often. We should find examples. You gotta hold these people to their standards. There's, there's actually, that's actually an Alinskyite strategy. Forget what, which one it is, one of the Rules for Radicals. But it basically is yeah, hold them, you know, just kind of hang them by their own standards, something along those lines. And that's what we did. So what, I hope in the future this sends a message to the alt-liteand to others like, OK if you're just gonna be grifting and being an opportunist [inaucdible] these issues that you clearly do not understand. I want these people to be terrified of [inaudible]... We're going to find a way to make them look bad. We're going to have, you know, basically the neets on the Internet to

find old social media accounts. It's what's known as open source research finding [inaudible, audio skips] Bob and no one really called too much of attention to it. Well it turns out you know, Conservatism, Inc. and it's still continuing. So I don't know, I think your career's probably over. The struggle for saving America, for saving our people. Basically speak out against the things that we know to be problems. And she thought wrong. She's paying the price. That girl is probably devastated. And that's too bad. But we're not doing [audio skips] the survival of our people, of our race, of our civilization. And you know, that doesn't mean that everyone who is not like, naming the Jew or talking about race needs to be subjected to [audio skips] no we're not. But we do have to enforce standards and that's, that's what we did. And I think that this is definitely a replicable strategy. So I hope that in the future, these types, when they talk about immigration, they you know, a sliver of fear shoots up their spine [audio skips] right is going to, you know, expose them for being the frauds that they are.

But at the same time it's, it's, you know, civic nationalism is about as far as you can go without losing all mainstream respectability so to speak.

It exists for them as for the mainstream media's concerned and so forth. But there

are a lot of people that are willing to. hear us out and that say, OK these guys are hard liners on immigration, good. So.
