During the afternoon hours of 4-December, members of the Patriot Front organization used Riverview Community Park as a staging-and-parking area in advance of a demonstration in Washington DC (they were transported between Riverview and Washington in rented U-Haul trucks). After the demonstration ended, they returned to Riverview where they discovered that an unknown person(s) had damaged most, if not all, of their personal and leased vehicles: the vehicles had been spray-painted, scratched, their tires flattened, their windows smashed. The group contacted police for assistance. In total, about seventeen cars were damaged; thirteen members of the group asked for police reports. At the time of this writing, officers continue to post at Riverview until all members of the group can make the necessary vehicle repairs and tows to safely clear the park.
