16	exercise a general supervision over the public health and environment of the city, and shall have full

- 20 The external ambient temperature is predicted by the National Weather Service to be (1) 21 thirty-two (32) degrees Fahrenheit or higher during the period of citation, arrest, or other enforcement; 22

- 23 (2) The manager of the Department of Public Health and Environment has certified, by 24 reasons of facts stated in writing, that enforcement is or was necessary to mitigate a condition that would cause greater imminent peril to the health or safety of any person than the threat to health 25 posed by exposure to existing weather conditions; and (2) The manager of the department of public 26 27 health and environment has memorialized in writing the department's conclusion that enforcement is or 28 was necessary to mitigate a condition that would cause greater imminent peril to the health or safety 29 of any person than the threat to health posed by exposure to existing weather conditions and facts 30 supporting that conclusion; and

32 (1)(3) The officer orally requests or orders the person to refrain from the alleged violation of this 33 section and, if the person fails to comply after receiving the oral request or order, the officer tenders a 34 written request or order to the person warning that if the person fails to comply the person may be 1 cited or arrested for a violation of this section; and

2 (2)(4) The officer attempts to ascertain whether the person is in need of medical or human services assistance, including, but not limited, to mental health treatment, drug or alcohol 3 4 rehabilitation, or homeless services assistance. (d) Nothing in subsection (c) above shall be construed to prohibit an agency or department
from offering medical or human services assistance, including but not limited to, mental health
treatment, drug or alcohol rehabilitation, homeless services assistance, or temporary or permanent
housing solutions regardless of the external ambient temperature.
