14	to file motions on constitutionality,
15	particularly as to now the verdict on Count 3 and
16	the statutory sentence with Count 3.
17	THE COURT: All right. We'll do a
18	three-week sentencing date. I expect any motion
19	papers that are filed, we better make it two
20	weeks for the defense, one week for a State

23	Honor, a presentence investigation be prepared
24	including a psychological evaluation.

THE COURT: I'll order the PSI, but not

the psychological. These are mandatory life sentences, but he is entitled to a PSI under the law. All right. Dates. (Off the record discussion.) THE COURT: October 25th at 9 a.m. for sentencing. Hold without bail for bail. (Court adjourned.)
