While enroute the robbery had turned into a shooting. Upon arrival I began assisting by securing the scene with crime scene tape. I then assisted in protecting the scene on Franklin av e just east of 25 av s until I was released from the scene.

On 01-06-2010 at approx 1947 hrs while working marked squad 320 with my partner OFFICER BRUGGER, we were dispatched to a burglary of business in progress at 2431 East Franklin Av S. Remarks were updated before we arrived saying that the caller was locked inside of the freezer inside of the business and she heard 2 shots inside of the store. Further added remarks stated that witnesses outside of the business saw three victims inside of the store and one might be possibly still breathing.

Upon arrival, I saw one person down in the doorway of the business and another person down just inside of the doorway. As we were just getting inside of the store some of the witnesses outside of the business were stating that a suspect was possibly still inside of the store. My partner and I entered the store to make the scene safe and check the victims. I cleared the left side of the store and noticed a third body that was covered by a potato chip bag shelving unit colored red. I picked up the red shelving unit and moved it off of the victim that was lying on the ground so that I could get past him and clear the back of the business.

After moving past the third victim I cleared to the back of the store and heard two people yelling from inside of the beverage cooler. I finished clearing the back of the business and then secured the male and female (the female was later identified via MN DL as Witness#1/AHMED) that were hiding in the beverage cooler. I lead both the male and female out of the side of the business and then secured them into separate squad cars.

I then spoke to W1/AHMED, she stated that she came into the store and asked one of the employees if they sold somali coffee. W1/AHMED stated that the employee said yes and that the employee pointed her in the direction of where it was located.

W1/AHMED stated that she went back to where the coffee was located and grabbed two bags of coffee, while she was grabbing the bags of coffee a male employee who she saw mopping the floors was being lead back to where she was getting the coffee by a male with a black mask covering his face. W1/AHMED stated that at this point the male with the black mask was yelling something in SOMALI at her and the employee. W1/AHMED stated that she started saying that she has a family and children and "PLEASE DON'T KILL ME".

W1/AHMED stated she heard approx. 2 shots and that the male with the mask took off towards the front of the store after the shots. W1/AHMED stated that she started telling the employee that she was with "HOW DO WE GET OUT OF HERE" and "IS THERE A WAY OUT." W1/AHMED stated that the male employee with her lead them both back to the beverage cooler and they ran inside and closed the door hiding there until officers arrived and let them out.

After securing the scene until; car 710 and car 21 arrived, car 710 advised my partner and I to transport W1/AHMED to Room 108 where she was interviewed. W1/AHMED was transported home by a family member.

On 01/06/2010, I was assigned to marked Squad 320 with my partner Officer Klimpke. At a bout 1947 hours, we responded to the area of 24th Av S and E Franklin on a report of a robbery of business. While enroute to the call it was updated to a shooting.

We arrived and were flagged down by a group of people waving us into the store. As we approached the store, I observed two males that were laying face down in the front entry way. I observed a pool of blood in the doorway and on the sidewalk. We were told that there may be a suspect in the back of the store.

We entered the store, and I observed another male laying face down by a snack rack. We then searched the store and did not locate any potential suspects. Once we got to the back of the store, I heard yelling coming from the beverage cooler.

I observed two people in the cooler, they were brought out and it was determined that they were not involved in the crime. One was a female, who was identified as Witness 1/Ahmed. W1/Ahmed described the suspect as a Somali male, about 510 and had a skinny build and was wearing a black face mask. W1/Ahmed stated that she saw two other males in the store and was getting scared, she asked a store employee who is listed as Witness 2 if there was a back door or a way to get out of the store.

W1/Ahmed stated that she was walked to the back of the store by W2 and they walked into the beverage cooler. While in the cooler, W1/Ahmed was able to call 911 from her cell phone.

W1/Ahmed and W2 were then escorted out of the store and were placed in separate Squads.

I then continued to maintain the scene and assist with crowd control. The owner of the store arrived and I was asked by 710 to retrieve keys to the store. I received the keys and I assisted Sgt. Folkens with checking the basement of the store. Myself and Sgt Folkens checked an apartment that was attached to the business. The apartment was owned by the business and was used for their offices, we found no one inside.

We were then given the Ok to transport W1/Ahmed to room 108 to be interviewed. Witness 2 was also transported to room 108 by another Squad. The sister of W1/Ahmed showed up at city hall and she was allowed to go home with her. While at room 108, witness 2 started to complain of chest pain. Ambulance and rescue were ordered code 3. W2 was then transported to HCMC via ambulance.

I responded to what was originally a robbery of a business in progress along with several other officers. While en route. The call was updated that several people had possibly been shot inside the store.

I arrived just after several other officers had entered the store. I stepped over one victim who was laying in the front doorway and assisted in clearing the store and back room areas of any other potential threat(s). I could see there were a total of three victims in the store. All appeared to be dead.

After securing the store, I was directed to three people who were waiting on the corner.

I first spoke with Witness 3 (MERGENS) and Witness 4 (ADAMS). Both of these parties are in town temporarily on business. They said they had been approximately one block to the west, walking eastbound on Franklin Avenue when they heard several gunshots. As they were about a block away, they could not tell exactly where the shots were coming from and they continued to walk eastbound on Franklin Avenue. Both parties said they saw the victim that was laying in the front doorway as they approached the store and they waited for police. Both parties said they did not see any suspect(s) at all leave the store and from the position they were at when they heard the shots, it is obvious that if the suspect(s) left the front door and immediately turned to the south they would not have seen the suspect(s).

I spoke with Witness 2 (FLECK). Due to the cold and the fact that Witness 2 (FLECK) had seen the suspect(s), I interviewed him in my Squad Car. Witness 2 (FLECK) said that he lives behind the business and he had been walking in the alley behind the business on his way to another store located several blocks to the east on Franklin Avenue. Witness 2 (FLECK) said as he was walking in the alley behind the store he heard several loud noises but he was not sure what they were. As Witness 2 (FLECK) left the back of the building and started to walk along the east side of the building, he said he saw a suspect running southbound on 25th Avenue towards him. Witness 2 (FLECK) said he immediately put together that the sounds he heard were possibly gunshots and that the person running towards him may have just shot somebody. Witness 2 (FLECK) said the lighting was very poor and he only got a basic description of the suspect. Witness 2 (FLECK) described the suspect as being approximately 5'6" and wearing all dark colored clothing and possibly a dark colored hat. Witness 2 (FLECK) said it is possible that he caught a partial glimpse of somebody running behind Suspect 1 but he had no information about anybody else. Witness 2 (FLECK) said he was immediately in fear and ran to the east and then doubled back on Franklin Avenue towards the store since he figured that the suspect(s) had left the area and possibly continued southbound.

I advised supervisors at the scene as to this general information and I



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released all three Witnesses after getting their statements.

Upon our arrival, board up services had unsecured the front door. We were met by Sgt Kjos and Sgt Porras and viewed the surveillance video. The video shows one suspect wearing gloves on both hands and the second suspect wearing only one glove. The second suspect touched a wire display rack south of the front counter and the interior of the front door frame with the ungloved hand.

Under the direction and supervision of FS Bunkers, I took overall photographs of the store's front area.

FS Bunkers took DNA sample swabs from the wire rack. FS Bunkers then processed and examined the wire rack and the interior side of the front door frame.

Ridge detail was developed on both areas, but was insufficient for comparison.

FS Bunkers and I searched for firearms evidence. A DCC was located on the floor underneath an over turned snack display rack and snacks. The DCC was photographed and approximate measurements were taken for the sketch. FS Bunkers collected the DCC and found it to be a Federal 40 S&W.

The DNA sample swabs and the DCC were brought back to the Crime Lab Unit. The DCC was processed and examined for latent print evidence by FS Bunkers. No ridge detail was developed.

The DNA sample swabs and DCC were inventoried in the Property and Evidence Unit.

The photographs will be retained in the Crime Lab Unit Major Case files.

There was a small sample jar inside the bag that contained what appeared to be a tooth. Both hands were bagged. The decedent was wearing the following:

Brown lace-up 'Totes' boots

White socks

Jeans

Grey sweat pants under the jeans

Black belt with metal buckle

Grey ribbed-style undershirt

Tan colored long sleeved shirt with turtle neck, defect on left arm

Dark brown jacket with fleece lining, defect on left arm

A wallet and misc. paperwork was recovered from the jean pockets, and a cell phone with keys was recovered from the front jacket pocket.

Externally, the decedent had a defect determined to be a gunshot wound to his right palm area, continuing through to the back of the right hand. The decedent had a defect determined to be a gunshot wound to the left bicep area. The x-ray examination showed the bone in this area to be broken as well.

The decedent had an abrasion on his forehead, above his right eye area.

There was a small laceration noted on the top of the decedents head.

A defect determined to be a gunshot wound was located on the back of the victim's head, near the bottom right of the skull area, or near the upper neck.

A corresponding gunshot wound is located on the left chin area of the decedent, with the skin around the wound appearing stellate.

Dr. Firchau stated that a spent projectile from the left bicep gunshot wound was located in the back area of the decedent. The cause of death was determined to be multiple gunshot wounds and the manner as homicide. See report of Hennepin County Medical Examiner for full details.

Sgt. Folkens received a call from dispatch and notified of a business robbery where shots had been fired. A short time later Sgt. Folkens received updated information that there were three victims who were deceased. The location of this incident is Seward Market is located at 2431 E. Franklin Ave.

After learning this information, investigators responded to the scene and arrived at approximately 2005 hrs. While en-route, investigators contacted, Sgt. Porras who was the on-call homicide investigator with his partner Sgt. Ann Kjos.

Weather conditions at time of arrival were approximately 7 degrees, overcast skies, with winds at 1 mph. While at scene, a light snow started at approximately 0200 hrs.

Seward Market is located on the SW corner of 25th Ave S and E. Franklin Av. This building is described as a 2 story building atop of a basement. The Seward Market occupies the main level of this building. The main exterior door to the Seward Market faces Franklin Ave on the NE corner of the building. There is a second exterior door to the rear area of the business on the east side of the building. This door was locked with a slide lock that can only be opened from the inside. There is a locked glass exterior door that faces Franklin Ave on the north side of this building that leads to the second floor of the building. This door was found to be locked and the alarm activated inside.

The overhead lights were on and illuminated this business. This business is equipped with several surveillance cameras. A large monitor is displayed behind the front counter area.

Victim 1 was face down in the main exterior doorway of the business. Victim 1's outer clothing consisted of a brown coat and jeans. There was a DCC located in the area between Victims 1's legs. Victim 1's head was near the threshold of the main exterior door and his legs extended out of the business. The main door was open and resting on victim 1's leg. Victim 1's head was lying on the left foot of Victim 2.

Victim 2 was also face down and was just in front of victim 1. Victim 2's head was in front of the counter and his legs extended towards the main exterior door. There was a DCC on the ground next to victim 2's head.

Victim 2's outer clothing consisted of a black coat and black pants

Victim 3 was located in the isle on the east side of the business near the front of the store. Victim 3 was face down. Several racks of food, chips etc were knocked over and around victim 3. A metal fragment was located near victim 3.

There was a hole in the ceiling near the front counter and a hole in the



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ceiling near the rear of the store. The holes were later processed by MPD Crime Lab and did not appear to be related to this homicide.

A DCC was also located on the inside of the front window.

The front counter had a cash register and a cash drawer. Both contained money. Also in plain view on a shelf is an open money bag with paper currency inside.

In the rear of the store are two freezers. One of the freezers contains dairy products. This freezer has several glass doors. The glass doors face the inside of the business.

Towards the rear of the store on the west side of the business a wooden interior door that was kicked open. Investigators later learned the door was opened by responding officers.

Near the front counter on the west side of the business is a locked interior door that leads to the basement. A key provided to investigators by the owner, was used to unlock the door and clear the basement. In the basement investigators found the video recorders for the security cameras located inside and outside of the business.

MPD Crime Lab processed the scene.

At 2315 hours, personnel from the Hennepin County Medical Examiners (HCME) office arrived at the scene. The first body recovered was the Somali male found lying in the doorway of 2431 East Franklin Ave. HCME personnel removed a wallet from the victim's left rear pants pocket and showed me a DL bearing the DL# 18 USC 2721 & 2725, and the name of Mohamed Abdi Warfa. HCME assigned Warfa HCME # 2010-0059. Sgt. Folkens observed victim #1 to have his head on the shoe of victim #2. HCME personnel directed Sgt. Folkens attention to a defect to the right side of the victim's neck, the left chin area, the right hand, and on the victim's left sleeve. HCME personnel then placed this victim into a blue body bag, and secured this bag.

Next HCME personnel began the recovery of the victim lying just in front of the front sales counter. HCME personnel removed this victim's ID and showed it to Sgt. Folkens. I observed a DL in the name of Anwar Salah Mohammed dob/ 1/1/79. This DL had the number 18 USC 2/21 & 2/25. HCME personnel then directed Sgt. Folkens attention to the following defects: a defect to the front of the left ear, a defect to behind the right ear, there was also a defect noted to the upper middle back / neck area of the victim's jacket. When HCME personnel moved the victim to place him in a blue body bag, Sgt. Folkens observed a cellular telephone and a set of keys that were under the victim. These were recovered by Car 21.

HCME personnel then recovered the body of the 3rd victim. HCME personnel showed me a DL bearing the DL# 18 USC 2721 & 2725 with the name of Osman Jama Elmi dob/ 10-06-1981. HCME personnel drew Sgt. Folkens attention to a defect in the left shoulder area of this victim as well as a second defect located in the left lower back.

After the bodies of the victim's were removed, the scene was documented by photographs, video and sketches, and preliminary processing of the scene were completed. Investigators had instructed uniformed officers to have Car 21 secure the front door with a key, and to have uniformed officers have the front door boarded to secure this crime scene until the surveillance video could be viewed, and a more directed / detailed crime scene processing could



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be conducted.

On 01/06/2009 while working marked squad 8313 with my partner Officer Nutter, at approximately 1947 hours we responded to a robbery of business call at 2431 Franklin Ave. E.

Upon arrival I went in the Seward Market to clear the scene along with other officers at the scene. Inside the business I observed three victims dead on the floor with merchandises scattered inside the business.

I was ordered to set up the crime scene tape to preserve the scene. I was also asked to canvas the area by knocking on doors in the 2000 block of 25th Ave. I spoke with Robert Edward Bentler at [REDACTED] who stated that he heard several "bang" noise coming from area of the business. He stated that he thought that it was a sound of dumpster bang. At that time, Mr. Bentler stated that he was inside his house, therefore he did not see anything.

I later was assigned to keep watch in the back alley of the incident address to prevent pedestrians from crossing the crime tape. While I was there, I spoke to concerned friends and family members of the victims. The following people provided me their names and phone numbers so they could be updated regarding the incident.

On 01/06/2010 @ 2003 hours, Car 21 (FS Mink and I) was dispatched by MECC to 2431 Franklin AV. E. (Seward Market and Halal Meats) in reference to a robbery of business in progress. Car 22 (FS Bunkers and FS Langness) responded at approximately 2133 to assist with crime scene processing.

Upon arrival, FS Mink and I were briefed by Sgt. Karakostas. It was explained that a shooting had occurred and there were three deceased males at the scene. The suspects were believed to have entered and exited the scene through the front door. Witnesses were thought to have retreated to a walk-in cooler in the rear portion of the store during the incident.

The scene was located on the southwest corner of Franklin AV. E. and 25th AV. S. The building was a two-story structure with a basement; the incident was thought to be confined to the main level of the building, which was occupied by the Seward Market and Halal Meats. Sidewalks bordered the north and east sides of the building. An alley was located south of the building and a small parking lot was on the west side. The store's front door faced northeast on the northeast corner of the building, and the rear door was located along the building's east side. The sales counter and basement door were in the northwest portion of the store. There was an east and west aisle leading south to the rear of the store where a kitchen was located. Doors leading to a walk-in cooler and walk-in freezer were located west portion of the kitchen.

In the front doorway, a deceased male was face down with the front door resting against his left side. He was observed wearing brown boots, white socks, blue jeans, and a brown jacket. His legs were partially extended to the northeast and his head was resting on the threshold of the front door. A blood-like-substance (BLS) was observed on his jeans and the exterior left side of his right boot. Small BLS stains were observed on the concrete outside, northeast of the front door, and the exterior windows and window frames west of the front door. On the interior of the front door, BLS was observed above the body of the deceased male and a metal bar was partially detached. A large pool of BLS was observed under the head of the deceased in the doorway and continued along the store's exterior, east of the front door, and the area just inside the threshold.

A second deceased male was on the floor between the front door and sales counter, with his left foot resting against the back portion of the head of the deceased male in the doorway. The deceased male in front of the sales counter was observed lying face down wearing black shoes, black socks, black pants, a black jacket, and black rimmed eyeglasses. His left leg was extended to the east and his right leg was partially extended to the east. His head was lying in a large pool of BLS along the customer side of the store's L-shaped sales counter.

South of the first two deceased males, in the east aisle, a third deceased



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male was observed face down surrounded by displaced packaged snacks. He was wearing grey shoes, white socks, grey striped pants, and a dark grey sweater over a light grey striped shirt. His head was located to the north and his feet were extended to the southwest. His left arm was partially extended to the west near a black camera/cell phone.

Two discharged cartridge casings (DCCs) were observed outside the front door. Two DCCs and a metal fragment were observed inside the store. Several small merchandise racks in the store's north portion were displaced and miscellaneous merchandise was strewn about the floor around the racks. On the floor between the merchandise racks and the sales counter, small BLS stains were observed. A small hole was observed in a ceiling tile near the sales counter.

Behind the sales counter, a red Motorola (T-Mobile) camera/cell phone with a charging cord was plugged into an outlet along the west wall. The cash register was closed, and when it was opened, the contents appeared to be undisturbed. Below the cash register, rolled coins and a bank bag containing cash also appeared to have been undisturbed.

Near the middle of the store, along the west side, a door providing access to an employee's restroom was observed; the door was forced open by the officers securing the scene. A second hole was observed in a ceiling tile a short distance north of the employee's restroom. The door leading to the basement was found locked upon arrival of Car 21, and located within the basement was the security system recording equipment.

The following items were marked with evidence markers (EM) and/or numbered scales:

- " EM #1 - one DCC on the sidewalk north of the front door
- " EM #2 - one DCC on the concrete between the legs of the deceased male in the doorway
- " EM #3 - one DCC on the interior window sill along the north wall
- " EM #4 - one DCC in the pool of BLS near the of the deceased male in front of the sales counter
- " EM #5 - one metal fragment on the floor north of the deceased male in the east aisle
- " EM #6 - small BLS stains on the floor between the merchandise racks and sales counter
- " EM #7 - hole in a ceiling tile near sales counter
- " EM #8 - hole in a ceiling tile north of the employee's restroom
- " EM #9 - one black HTC (T-mobile) camera/cell phone near the deceased male in the east aisle
- " EM #10 - small BLS stains on the concrete outside the front door. (The BLS stains near EM #10 were observed to contain directionality, thus the stains were grouped into four areas which were marked with scales numbered #10A - #10D)
- " EM #11 - small BLS stains on the concrete outside the front door
- " EM #12 - small BLS stains on the exterior windows and window frames west of the front door
- " EM #13 - small BLS stains on the exterior left side of the right boot of the deceased male in the doorway
- " Scale numbered #14 - wipe marks through the BLS stains marked with EM #12
- " Scale numbered #15 (originally incorrectly marked with a scale numbered



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#13) area of BLS on the window frame west of the front door
FS Mink photographed the scene before and after markers and numbered scales were placed.

I videotaped the scene. It should be noted that the video was taken prior to marking EM #9 - scales numbered #15.

FS Bunkers, assisted by FS Langness, took approximate measurements and prepared a rough sketch of the scene.

The Hennepin County Medical Examiner (HCME) personnel arrived and took custody of the decedents. FS Mink took additional photographs after the decedents were moved. The following items were found beneath the deceased male in front of the sales counter:

" One pair of keys on a keyring with a green piece of plastic with BLS

" One black Sony Ericcson (T-Mobile) camera/cell phone with BLS

FS Mink processed and examined the following for latent evidence:

" Exterior of front door

" Interior of front door

" Exterior of basement door

Ridge detail was developed on the interior glass of the front door. This ridge detail was marked, photographed, and lifted. Ridge detail, which was insufficient for comparison, was developed on the exterior of the front door. A possible fabric impression was developed, photographed, and lifted from the interior glass of the front door. No ridge detail was developed on the basement door.

FS Bunkers collected the following items:

" EM #1 DCC

" EM #2 DCC

" EM #3 DCC

" EM #4 DCC with BLS

" EM #5 metal fragment

I examined the holes in the ceiling tiles and determined the holes to be unrelated to this incident. In addition, I collected the following items:

" Swabs from the BLS near EM #6

" Black camera/cell phone (EM #9)

" Swabs from the BLS near scale numbered #10A

" Swabs from the BLS near scale numbered #10B

" Swabs from the BLS near scale numbered #10C

" Swabs from the BLS near scale numbered #10D

" Swabs from the BLS near EM #11

" Swabs from the BLS above EM #12

" Swabs from the BLS near EM #13

" Swabs from the BLS near scale numbered #14

" Swabs from the BLS near scale numbered #15

" Swabs from the BLS on the interior of the front door

" Partially detached metal bar from the interior front door

" Pair of keys on a keyring with a green piece of plastic with BLS from beneath the deceased male in front of the sales counter

" Black camera/cell phone with BLS from beneath the deceased male in front of the sales counter

" Red camera/cell phone with wall charging cord from behind the sales counter



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FS Mink and I cleared the scene at approximately 0230 hours. Upon our arrival to the Crime Lab, I photographed the pair of keys on the keyring with the green piece of plastic and the three cell phones (one with charging cord).

FS Bunkers took custody of the store keys from Sgt. Folkens. The front door and rear door were locked by FS Bunkers, and board-up services personnel further secured the front door. FS Bunkers and FS Langness cleared the scene at approximately 0245 hours and upon arrival to City Hall, FS Bunkers turned over the store keys to Sgt. Kjos.

Within the Crime Lab Unit, FS Bunkers found the DCCs marked by EM #1 - EM #3 to be Federal 40 S&W, and the DCC marked with EM #4 to be a Blazer 40 S&W. The DCCs were then processed and examined for latent evidence; no ridge detail was developed. FS Bunkers cleaned the metal fragment (#5) and DCC (#4).

The metal bar will be inventoried within the MPD-Property and Evidence Unit once processing is complete.

All other collected items have been inventoried within the MPD-Property and Evidence Unit.

The recovered ridge detail will be examined and a report will be forthcoming.

The photographs were transferred to disks and will be retained in the MPD Crime Lab Unit major case file along with the video and sketch.

During the course of this homicide investigation, Sgt Porras and I were able to view surveillance video from 2431 E Franklin Av. On this surveillance video, the images clearly show two males enter the Seward Hallah Market; both males had their faces concealed but each were wearing distinctive clothing.

Sgt Porras and I met with a concerned citizen who stated he had information about the murder at 2431 E Franklin Av. This concerned citizen told Sgt Porras and I he spoke with a male friend that gave him specific details regarding the sequence of events prior to, during and after the homicide at 2431 E Franklin Av. These details included businesses they went into in the hours prior to the shooting at 2431 E Franklin Av.

This male friend of the concerned citizen was identified and transported to Room 108 for an interview. Post Miranda, the male friend of the concerned citizen told Sgt Porras and I he was with his cousin Ahmed-Shire Abdi Ali, [REDACTED]. The friend of the concerned citizen said he and Ahmed and another identified male drove to the Mpls Impound Lot and then to the Super America on 22/Lyndale Av N.

Sgt Porras obtained the surveillance video for 1-6-10 from SA, 22nd and Lyndale Av N. On that date at about 1640 hours a male enters the store and can be seen approaching a cash register. This male was wearing clothing which was identical to that of one of the suspects who participated in the shootings that led to the deaths of three male victims. The face of the male wearing the distinctive clothing was captured on this video and could be positively identified as Ahmed-Shire Abdi Ali, dob [REDACTED].
